In July, 1970 — Cloudburst in the upper catchment area led to a 15 metre rise in the Alaknanda river in Uttarakhand. Entire river basin, from Hanumanchatti near the holy pilgrimage town of Badrinath to Haridwar was affected; An entire village was swept away.

Several years ago in the north Queensland mountains a 5 metre high wall of water rushed down a mountain and claimed the life of a foreign tourist. Toowoomba and Grantham are not the first of this phenomena in Australia, they are just the first filmed.
