

In May of this year of 2011 I will have been a resident of the Lockyer Valley region for 5 years.

My move here was mostly for health reasons and this has served me well. Unfortunately like many

others the area now holds mostly sorrow and now also more health issues. I say these things

because they have all to do with the 11th January 2011 flooding of the Valley.

Since moving here I could never understand why the waterways were so overgrown and clogged

with all sorts of matter - these should always be kept clean and free of fallen trees etc for easy

flow of water and help keep flood waters safer by not carrying so much matter with them which

in turn destroys bridges and roads.

During the flooding in the weeks before the big event we as a household watched water levels

and saw for ourselves the extent of the water in our area. On the morning of the 11th we

realised that this was bigger that what we had previousley experienced but there was no phone

warning for evacuation. We rang our landlord who advised that it would be good to go to the

town hall in case of severe flooding. We did this and were evacuated by the airforce to Gatton

On returning home I checked our phone messages and found that at 11.21am we had been

issued an evacuation warning - we had left the house at around 9.00am and had just been able

to get into the township of Forest Hill. The warnings were too late.

The water did not rise enough to get into the house that we rent but rushed in underneath the

house and was stopped by the brick walls that go to the ground. (brick veneer house on stumps

with one trapdoor at back of house) Since coming home from the evacuation centre and over

the subsequent weeks we have now got rising damp - mould in the carpets - and health issues

such as asthma - headaches - general breathing problems - ear infections - sore throats.

I think that all homes that have any water either in, around, or under should be thouroughly

checked before the residents move back in. The clean up efforts in our area were great

but not all persons had the help.

Maybe some levee banks in some areas would save some properties and farms some of the recent grief.

This is an area that floods quickly and often but nothing has been learned.
