In response to your questions below:

- 1. Seqwater advises local Councils prior to a release. Council's have responsibility for required actions or notifications downstream of the dam. Please contact your local Council to discuss notifications if you feel it is important you are informed. Alternately, you can call 1800 613 122 anytime and a pre-recorded message on spilling/gated release activities will be available.
- 2. The office of the Water Grid Manager handles all media issues and enquiries. The WGM provides Seqwater with media releases to upload on our website as they wish. At your suggestion, Seqwater will now include a 'gates releasing' comment on our latest dam levels webpage for any upcoming releases, as required. This should be implemented over the coming days. Water level data at gauging stations along the mid-Brisbane River is updated several times a day on the BOM website $-\frac{\text{http://www.bom.gov.au/qld/flood/}}{\text{nttp://www.bom.gov.au/qld/flood/}}$
- 3. The releasing of water from Seqwater dams is regulated in accordance with the Water Supply (Safety and Reliability) Act 2008. The Flood Control Manual is used to manage releases in accordance with this Act.

Hello, 1. Can you please tell me how I can get a 'sure fire' warning of impending releases of water from the dams listed above? My land adjoins the Brisbane River at Kholo. We got caught out on this last release. 2. Also, your media websites haven't been updated since November and your Dam Capacities info doesn't show Wivenhoe Dam releasing. The Brisbane River, here, is about 3 metres above normal level at the moment and Wivenhoe is releasing a greater than normal water flow. 3. Almost all the catchments are at100% capacity in SE QLD. A number of respected agencies are predicting a possible 1974 flood scenario for this summer. Are the QLD Government and SEQ Water considering reducing the stored water capacity of the dams to provide an added flood buffer to prevent another 1974 disaster? Regards Ray Miller
