

The Gladstone LDCC remain at the same level, that is holding a monitoring brief at this time and have not activated. There has not been any change in the preparatory actions taken with regards to movement of assets to vulnerable areas and media releases to the community and store owners regarding consideration of stocking of supplies in case of isolation issues and other actions for consideration in case of flood event. Especially the vulnerable areas of Agnes Water, Rosedale, Miriam Vale.

There have not been any substantial rainfalls in the Gladstone Regional Council areas and no impending issues at this time except for the continual monitoring of Awoonga Dam levels as any sudden influx may impact on communities below the dam wall (Pikes Crossing, Benaraby, Tannum Sand Boyne Island) and at rear of the dam itself (Boyne Valley). SES personnel assisted with a letter drop of information pamphlets to properties that may be affected by flooding in those areas on 24th December.

The Gladstone LDCC is aware of the predicted forecasts for tomorrow.

The Banana LDMG activated on 24th December 2010 primarily in relation to flood water heights impacting on Theodore. The Gladstone DDCC moved to 'leaning forward' status with the disaster coordination centre in readiness for full activation.

The Banana Shire Local Disaster Management Group re-activated the Local Disaster Coordination Centre at 6.30am this morning in response to the increase in flood water in the Dawson River at Theodore, which occurred overnight as a result of storm rains at 5:00pm yesterday. The Centre will remain active and will move to an on-call basis as of 2300 hours tonight and reactivate at 0600 hours unless concerns over the Dawson River at Theodore increase. Advice that the flood peak for Theodore has been reviewed with a new predicted height of 13.6m. It is expected that this level will stay at this height should the area not receive more rain. However, now expecting rain of approx 50-100ml each day in the area and rain forecast to continue up to Friday 31/12/10.

A further community briefing was held at 10:00am this morning to advise of the situation and possible cause of actions to be undertaken. Police and SES personnel have been conducting door knocks to residents likely to be affected by rising water levels in preparation of any likely evacuations. The height measurement in Theodore at 1900hrs today is 13.55m and steady. Height measurement in Moura at 1400hrs today is ,27m and rising slowly. Height measurement in Baralaba at 1500hrs today is 13.6m and rising. Levels are constantly being monitored in liaison with the Bureau of Meteorology.

ast river level rises are also occurring downstream to Moura where a major flood peak to about 12.5 metres is expected in the next 24 hours. Levels will remain high into next week. Major flooding is rising at Baralaba, with fast rises expected during Friday as upstream floodwaters arrive. A major flood peak of at least 14 metres is expected over the weekend. Higher levels to 14.5 metres are possible. Flood levels at Baralaba are already similar to the 1983 flood.

The revised water level has resulted in some road closures in the local area. The level has now exceeded that recorded during the March 2010 flood event. 



Situation Overview



Currently overcast and rain predominately affecting the coastal centers of the District causing localized flooding in Agnes Water, Calliope, Rosedale areas with the falls easing into the afternoon. Taroom, Moura and Baralaba had isolated showers with Theodore mainly fine.

2. Damage Assessment Overview

At this time there are no reports of substantial damage.

Still remains at minor inundation of five residences at Theodore with expectation that further properties maybe affected if rain persists and river height increases and still only the six families have self relocated. Issues predominately surrounding road closures due to flooding throughout the District.

Regional Reports

4. Summary Of Past 24 Hours By DDMG / LDMG / Region

(Include brief details of operations; visits, etc)

The Gladstone LDCC remain at the same level, holding a monitoring brief at this time and have not activated as all matters are being handled at agency level. There has not been any change in the preparatory actions taken with regards to movement of assets to vulnerable areas and media releases to the community and store owners regarding consideration of stocking of supplies in case of isolation issues and other actions for consideration in case of flood event.

Overnight steady rain has caused widespread road closures, isolating the vulnerable area of Agnes Water, which is a regular occurrence with sustained rain events. This morning road access to Gladstone could only be achieved from the south with all other directions closed due to flooding. Rosedale has suffered widespread events flooding.

There are no impending issues at this time except for the continual monitoring of Awoonga Dam levels as any sudden influx may impact on communities below the dam wall (Pikes Crossing, Benaraby, Tannum Sand Boyne Island) and at rear of the dam itself (Boyne Valley). The dam levels have increased to 41.876 and the Gladstone Regional Council hold a current prediction at the rate of rise of 43m.

The Banana LDCC remains activated and the Gladstone DDCC at 'leaning forward' status with the disaster coordination centre in readiness for full activation.

Due to the less than anticipated rainfall experienced at Theodore the Dawson River actually fell this morning and is holding around 13.40m. This is being monitored closely by the Banana Local Disaster Coordination Centre and they advise that this height is subject to change in line with current meteorology predictions. Ergon Energy have informed that as a safety precaution power to houses where the water level begins to cover the floor will be cut. Due to the flood levels, any access to Theodore is still by boat or air at this stage. A town meeting occurred at the RSL at 12pm and residents of Theodore were advised to attend the RSL in the event they evacuate from their houses. There are still some residents living in there houses at the northern end of Theodore which have water surrounding them. These residents are happy to wait to see what the water level does before making a decision to evacuate and are aware of the emergency point when they wish to do so. At 1300hrs the Leichhardt Highway was reopened for 4x4 access only for south bound local traffic only as far as Palm Tree Creek (main road approval), reports are that Palm Tree Creek is sitting approximately .8m. The main road running north out of town through Fruit Salad Corner to Banana mains closed. There is an expectation that the river height may rise again tonight due to the behaviour of creek at 1.5m (Eidsvold).

Height measurement in Moura at 0630hrs today is 12.33m and steady. Height measurement in Baralaba at 0900hrs today is 13.9m and rising. Levels are constantly being monitored in liaison with the Bureau of Meteorology. Flood levels at Baralaba are already similar to the 1983 flood with further rises and higher levels possible with further forecast rainfall. Downstream of Baralaba, river levels above the 1983 peak are expected in the next few days. It is likely the Capricorn Highway bridge at Duaringa will be flooded on Sunday or Monday. Rises and major flooding is being recorded in the Dee River with moderate flooding expected in Don River at Rannes during Monday.

Efforts are being made to have John McDougall (BSC) relocate to Theodore on Sunday 26/12/10 to assist Cr Becker. Theodore SES have been filling and distributing sandbags to local Theodore residents. Signage has been placed at Banana, Taroom and Miles to notify the closure of the Highway to Theodore. Similarly relief staff for Theodore SES have been hampered by the widespread road closures.





Isolated showers still remain and widespread road closures still exist. Agnes Water, Rosedale, Many Peaks are isolated. Bruce Highway is open through District and the Dawson Higway to Biloela is also open from Gladstone. There are no impending issues at this time except for the continual monitoring of Awoonga Dam levels which at 0800 hours was at 42.668m and the Gladstone Regional Council advise that the Gladstone Area Water Board hold a current prediction at the rate of rise of 44m.

The Banana LDCC remains activated.

Overnight the situation at Theodore deteriorated. The Dawson River height increased towards 13.7m and as at 1000 hours was 13.82m. Due to this the LDCC activated late last night and commenced planning for evacuation of residents, and patients at the Aged Care facility and Theodore Hospital. 

The Gladstone LDCC remain at the same level, holding a monitoring brief at this time and have not activated

There has not been any change in the preparatory actions taken with regards to movement of assets to vulnerable areas and media releases to the community and store owners regarding consideration of stocking of supplies in case of isolation issues and other actions for consideration in case of flood event.

Overnight the situation at Theodore deteriorated. The Dawson River height increased towards 13.7m and as at 1000 hours was 13.82m. Due to this the LDCC activated late last night and commenced planning for evacuation of residents, and patients at the Aged Care facility and Theodore Hospital. These operations are currently underway and further details will be supplied in due course. SES and QPS personnel are currently conducting flood boat operations with properties in Theodore to assist with evacuations from residences, ain further details will be supplied in due course as numbers are confirmed. A community briefing will be all at 12.00pm today at the Theodore RSL Hall to advise residents of the situation and possible cause of actions to be undertaken. Ergon Energy have informed that as a safety precaution power to houses where the water level begins to cover the floor will be cut. Due to the flood levels, any access to Theodore is still by boat or air at this stage. Residents of Theodore have been advised to attend the RSL in the event they evacuate from their houses.

Overnight heavy rainfall in the Upper Dawson River has produced fast river level rises and a return to moderate to major flood levels at Taroom. Floodwaters from the Taroom area are expected to prolong major flood levels at Theodore during this week. Major flooding is rising at Baralaba, with fast rises expected during Monday as upstream floodwaters arrive. A level of 14m was recorded for Baralaba at 6.00am this morning. Higher levels to 14.5 metres are possible. Flood levels at Baralaba are about 0.4 metres higher than the 1983 flood. Higher levels are possible with further forecast rainfall. Downstream of Baralaba, river levels above the 1983 peak are expected in the next few days. The Capricorn Highway at the Dawson River Bridge is flooded. Height measurement in Moura is 12.48 and rising slowly.

Sewerage treatment Plant in Theodore has been switched off and plant is isolated by floodwaters but still functioning. The reservoir is currently 90% full. Baralaba Water Treatment Plant is operational; the river ight would need to rise another 2m before problems may arise.

Arrangements for Red Cross staff to attend and assist Theodore have been made and will hopefully be facilitated today (weather permitting). The evacuation process of the Theodore Aged Persons hostel has commenced and further information will be provided. Queensland Health in process of effecting evacuation of elderly patients at the Theodore Hospital (94yo, 98yo & 99yo).

Accommodation for evacuees has been organized for in excess of 130 in Moura. The Anglo Dawson mine has offered to pay for some of the costs of evacuation.

DDC has advised that helicopters are on standby (in Emerald) to evacuate 'at risk' residents. Discussion is still taking place to determine if this will happen. Conversations are between Theodore police, Cr Becker, Cr Clancy and to determine who wants/needs to evacuate. DDC will be advised when public meeting is complete soon after 3.30pm.



The Gladstone DDCC operations recommenced early this morning regarding the situation at Theodore which turned critical due to the rapid rise in river height during the evening causing inundation of township, loss of ground cover, evacuation of all residents to higher ground. The last recorded reading 14.51m at 0615 hours. Air operations have commenced at first light to evacuate all residents, the first flights concentrating

on the aged and health patients. The first flight contains one carer and seven residents of the Aged Care facility in Theodore which are being transported to Biloela. 

The last recorded reading is 14.59m at 1115 hours today. Air operations commenced at first light to evacuate all residents, the first flights concentrating
