Surat

Flood waters peaked on 04.01.2011. It is forecasted that no additional resources or resupply of food will be necessary. Once water subsides and road networks reopen, business will be as usual this is not expected before the end of the week. No damage to the shires utilities.

St George

All additional resources forecasted for have been deployed to St George. Additional staff have been identified and to be rotated by end of the week. Main body of water expected by the weekend at a level of 14m. LDMG have forecast for additional equipment and planning is in place for accommodation of evacuees at the evacuation centre. It is unknown how long water levels with remain high, but expected to be approx 1 week after peak.

Dirranbandi

Levee banks surrounding the town have been closed and heightened. Additional levee banks in sections are being created to individual premises identified as first at risk along the Balonne Minor River to the northern end of the town. Information provided by excavator operators and head hydrologist at Cubbie Station indicate that the town levee bank is about 1 metre higher than the peak river height of 5.28 metres in the March 2010 flood. If St George peaks at 1 metre higher that the March floods the river height at Dirranbandi is not expected to increase more that .3m at most (conservative estimate of rise). A road has been graded around the levee bank & inspections of the entire levee are being conducted on 05.01.2011 – regular inspections to be conducted 24/7.

Thallon

Levee bank has been secured and increased by 400ml.

Disaster Recovery meeting to be held at 1600hrs on 05.01.2011 to address future needs for this community once water subsides. Estimated that this will be approx 10.01.2011. Flood mapping has been provided, indicating areas of inundation and number of residents expected to be effected. Nil issues with food re-supply, sanitation & water. Mosquito fogging spraying is to commence on 06.01.2011 and will continue through until next week. Generators forecast in anticipation of any future power failures.

Dirranbandi

Continuous patrols to be conducted by local council officers of the levee bank to ensure that any issues are identified promptly. No current concerns re the integrity of the levee bank. Mosquito fogging spraying is to commence on 06.01.2011 and will continue through until next week. Nil issues with water, sanitation & food re-supply at this stage. Generator has been requested through the DDMG should power supply be interrupted (to be utilised in either St George & Dirranbandi accordingly).

Thallon

Town is becoming increasingly isolated due to increase in water levels, being monitored by local police officer. Nil issues anticipated for this area in relation to food, power & water.

Re-Supply

At present road transport of goods can be achieved through western NSW via Dubbo, Bourke and into Cunnamulla, Charleville and then east to Roma etc. Roma DDC & EMQ have been working road transport options as a first preference.

Roma DDC have been working on resupply to various locations throughout the District in the first instance by having SDCC (Peter MASON tasked from that location to assist) pressure major retailers to investigate alternative supply routes through NSW via road rather than simply wait for usual routes to re-open (out of Brisbane). Advice as of today is that Woolworths are loading 2 x single trailer semi-trailers out of West Wyalong (Sydney) to arrive some time Friday (48 pallets of goods if fully loaded).

Further effort needs to be put into the IGA chain as Woolworths is only in Roma and the smaller towns have IGA stores (Miles, St George) and Foodworks stores etc. Unsure of who supplies Foodworks.

Local DDMG reps (EMQ) have been working contacts in Charleville to have limited milk supplied delivered from Dubbo, advice is this will be achieved by Thursday for Roma (MRC). Balonne Shire have been advised for this contact and to also investigate limited milk supplied via these means.

"high-volume" purchasing being experienced. Roma is now starting to see a large number of heavy vehicles stack here waiting for roads to open as is the current situation in Miles. This is also having some impact of food and fuel supplies.

Further information concerning fuel supplies is now being collated at a District level and will be flagged separately to this message. Mention will also be made during SDCC teleconference even date.

Vehicles

In excess of 80 articulated vehicles are parked up at Miles & Roma is filling up also with vehicles waiting for access to east bound roads.

The Acting Roma Mayor today stated that the Council were opening up Bassett Park Show grounds for truck parking to relieve congestion around the town. This arrangement will be in place until the roads open and the need for truck parking is no longer required. This has been broadcast on Channel 40. There are toilets and shower blocks that have been opened for the use of the truck drivers at this site.

DC in liaison with QH, BSC LDMG have concerns regarding levels of water approaching Mungindi from the bondiwindi catchment. Anticipated that major flood levels will reach Mungindi by the weekend. 

DDMG has been working closely with retailers at a local and State level to ensure that essential food, such nilk, bread and other perishables are getting through. Supplies are coming in by road from Sydney and with Australia, and both Woolworths and IGA are expecting further supplies Friday and Saturday spectively. Message has been sent to the community via QPS Media, imploring people to refrain from high siume buying. Contingencies in place to ensure continued supply to our communities.

Fuel Supplies

Caltex has received diesel overnight from Emerald region so at this present time they are full, and are presently sourcing fuel from the Mackay as well. (Caltex Depot Manager) has advised that they close down the bowser at night so the tanks are not drained and that once the fuel dip reaches 10,000 litres bowsers are shut off to the public and the fuel is reserved for emergency vehicles only. Unleaded fuel is at a sufficient level at present. Caltex are working over the period of 24 hours with there fleet of fuel trucks to keep fuel available for the Roma Region.

BP Depot on Mitchell Road has no fuel available for any vehicles (including emergency vehicles). (BP Depot Manager) has been advised that there is some diesel fuel available for emergency vehicles at the BP (Kooka's) on Bowen Street, Roma. There will be a fuel delivery tonight which will fill up the bowsers/tanks at the service stations only and he believes that it will be possibly a week before the depot on Mitchell Road will have diesel available.


