Approximately 20 ENERGEX crews and contractors are continuing work in the area on repairs to the network where access to sites is available.

In terms of environmental recovery, Ipswich City Council is leading the "Clean Up Ipswich" program, with the assistance from the ADF(400-500), SES (4 crews), council staff, contractors and community volunteers (8000 yesterday). To date, approx 12500 tonnes of debris transferred to landfill sites, from the following areas of operation;

- ⇒ Goodna 80% completed
- ⇒ Karalee 45%


