SITUATION OVERVIEW

1. Summary of operations since last report

PREVIOUS INFORMATION

Heavy rainfall has been experienced in the Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley. As a result flooding has been experienced in areas around Laidley and Gatton.

Lockyer Valley LDMG was activated at 0450hrs 27/12/2010.

1. A caravan being used as a residence at [REDACTED] Road, Junction View near Gatton has been washed away. There were unconfirmed reports that two persons were inside the van, but occupants have now been located safe and well.
2. A risk assessment is being conducted of the Black Duck Creek floodwater which is expected to reach Gatton overnight. At this stage it is not expected to cause major flooding in the Gatton area.
3. Laidley Creek has burst its banks near Mulgowie. River Height is 8.6m and rising fast. This is expected to reach the Warrego Highway during the night and may cause road closures of the Highway. All alternate routes are currently closed.
4. The lower areas of Laidley will be flooded this evening. Local authorities are currently conducting a risk assessment to determine the extent of flooding expected. SES and police are currently conducting door-knocks of those affected and are providing advice. No evacuations have been instructed at this time pending the risk assessment.
5. Sandy Creek upstream of Forest Hill has burst its banks. A risk assessment is being conducted as to the impact to the town of Forest Hill. A door-knock has been conducted of the low lying areas of Forest Hill and occupants are being provided with advice. No evacuations have been instructed at this time pending the risk assessment.

UPDATE 28/12/2010

LOCKYER VALLEY

- Levels in Lockyer Creek and Laidley Creek are receding, flood levels are receding down stream at Glenore Grove.
- No further rainfall has occurred and it is expected that flood waters will continue to recede. There are no further problems expected.

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- LDMG is in recovery mode.

MILLMERRAN

- 3 residences have been evacuated and all occupants have relocated to family/friends.
- The Gore Highway is expected to remain closed by the Condamine River for approximately 3 days.
- No further problems are expected with the Millmerran area.

UPDATE 29/12/2010

Flooding continues to ease in Lockyer Creek and is expected to fall away quickly during today. Floodwaters in Millmerran are also subsiding. No further rainfall has occurred and no further problems are anticipated.

UPDATE 30/12/2010

Re-supply operations continue in the areas of Laidley, Cecil Plains, Tummaville and Millmerran. These are being handled locally.

FINAL UPDATE 31/12/2010

MILLMERRAN - Floodwaters have continued to recede. The Gore Highway at Millmerran is now flood free and repair work is being performed on the affected sections of Highway before it is re-opened to all traffic. This is expected to occur at 3:30pm today. Access to all rural roads in Millmerran District is now available. There are no remaining isolated properties in Millmerran.

CECIL PLAINS – Cecil Plains remains flood affected however floodwaters are receding. Access is available to Millmerran with high clearance vehicles only. No access is available to Toowoomba or Dalby at present from Cecil Plains. A number of rural properties in the area of Cecil Plains remain isolated. It is anticipated that all roads into Cecil Plains will become passable within 24 hours

No further rainfall is expected and no further problems are anticipated.

No further sitreps unless circumstances change.

UPDATE 6/1/2011

Heavy rainfall has been experienced in the Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley today. As a result localised flooding has occurred in Toowoomba and the Lockyer Valley.

TOOWOOMBA

The Warrego Highway at the Toowoomba Range is restricted to one lane open on the up section and two lanes open on the down section due to land/mud slides. Work is presently being conducted on the remaining lane and it is expected that the Range section of the Warrego Highway will be fully open to all traffic within the next few hours.

The Range Diversion Route via Murphy's Creek is closed due to flooding.

The Warrego Highway between Toowoomba and Oakey is closed. The Warrego Highway between Oakey and Dalby is closed at Jondaryon due to flooding.

The Toowoomba LDMG is leaning forward.

The Toowoomba DDMG is also leaning forward.

Toowoomba DDMG is conducting preliminary investigations into the capability of catering for possible evacuees from St George.

LOCKYER VALLEY

It is advised that Lockyer Valley LDMG has activated.

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The Warrego Highway through the Lockyer Valley is open with caution due to water over the road in several locations.

**The Mt Sylvia Road is closed due to flooding.
Several local access roads within the Lockyer Valley are closed.**

2. Projected Operations for next reporting period

LAIDLEY

- Continue to monitor floodwaters expected to reach Laidley this evening. Local authorities to complete risk assessment and if required evacuations will commence in the low lying areas of Laidley.

FOREST HILL

- Continue to monitor Sandy Creek as floodwaters approach Forest Hill. Risk assessment to finalised.

GATTON

- Continue to monitor Black Duck Creek floodwater as it approaches Gatton. There are no major implications expected in Gatton at this time.

WARREGO HIGHWAY

- The Warrego Highway remains open at this time. Floodwater from Laidley Creek is yet to reach the Warrego Highway and is expected to close the Warrego Highway overnight. All alternate routes are closed.
- A rock slide on the Toowoomba Range has closed one lane of traffic on both the up and down sections of the Warrego Highway. The Toowoomba Range Diversion (Via Murphy's Creek) is also closed due to rock slides and flooding.
- Oakey to Toowoomba is closed

UPDATE 28/12/1010

LOCKYER VALLEY

- Lockyer Valley Coordination Centre has closed down and recovery has commenced in Lockyer Valley areas of Grantham, Laidley and Forest Hill.
- Floodwaters are expected to continue to recede and clean up operations will continue to flood affected areas within these localities.
- Council work crews are attending to road closures, debris removal and other duties – daylight hours only unless more rain occurs.

MILLMERRAN

- Continue to monitor floodwaters and events as they arise. No further problems are anticipated.

UPDATE 29/12/2010

Continue to monitor events as they occur.

Several properties remain isolated. Arrangements for re-supply to these affected properties as required.

No further developments are expected.

UPDATE 30/12/2010

Floodwaters continue to cut Gore Highway Millmerran. Floodwaters are still affecting Cecil

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Plains, Tummaville and Millmerran areas.

Floodwaters have receded in Laidley area, however several rural properties remain isolated.

FINAL UPDATE 31/12/2010

Gore Highway at Millmerran is expected to open to all traffic at 3:30pm today.

Some properties in the Cecil Plains area remain isolated. Any requests for assistance have been dealt with at local level.

No further problems are anticipated.

It is expected that all roads providing access to Cecil Plains will be open within 24 hours.

UPDATE 6/1/2011**LOCKYER VALLEY**

- Continue to monitor rainfall and respond to any resultant floodwaters. Several road closures have occurred but the majority are expected to be open within the next few hours dependant upon further rainfall.

TOOWOOMBA

WARREGO HIGHWAY

- The Warrego Highway between Toowoomba and Oakey is also closed.
- The Warrego Highway through the Lockyer Valley is open with caution due to water over the road in several locations.

Several local access roads within the Lockyer Valley are closed.

3. Damage assessment overview*(Include brief Summary of effects)*

There is significant damage to highways and roads right across the District. Liaison will continue with DTMR as required.

Warrego Highway is expected to be closed overnight due to floodwater from Laidley Creek. Severe potholes have also occurred at Withcott with speed limit being reduced from 80km/h to 40km/h.

A rock slide on the Toowoomba range has closed one lane of traffic on both the down and up sections of the Warrego Highway. The Toowoomba Range Diversion route (via Murphy's Creek) is also closed due to rockslides.

UPDATE 28/12/2010**Lockyer Valley**

- Low lying areas in Laidley, Forest Hill and Grantham towns are flood affected – waters have/are receded
- Numerous properties remain cut off by roads closed in areas of Brightview, Glenore Grove, Lockrose,

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- Areas in the various valleys and creeks, inc Mt Sylvia, Black Duck, Ingoldsby and Townson remain isolated.
- A number of land slips have occurred blocking roads
- Gatton Evacuation Centre has been closed – all residents returning home

Moderate/Major damage to all highways and local roads with major pavement inundation. Liaison with DTMR will continue.

UPDATE 29/12/2010

Major damage to all Highways and local roads.

Major damage has occurred to a number of creek crossings and floodways. Reports that the bridge at McGarigal Road, Laidley West appears to have been washed away. This cannot be confirmed at this time due to lack of access.

Gore Highway remains closed at Millmerran and is expected to remain for a further 2 x days.

FINAL UPDATE 31/12/2010

Gore Highway Millerran has suffered severe damage as a result of floodwater and work is presently being conducted on the Highway by DTMR before it can be opened to all traffic. Gore Highway is expected to open to all traffic at 3:30pm today.

Access to Cecil Plains from Millmerran is available to high clearance vehicles only. Access routes to Cecil Plains are expected to become available within 24 hours.

UPDATE 6/1/2011

There is significant damage to highways and roads right across the District from previous flooding. Some of this was in the process of repair by local authorities. It is anticipated that further significant damage will occur. Liaison will continue with DTMR as required.

A rock/land slide on the Toowoomba Range had earlier closed the Warrego Highway. Work is being conducted to clear the remaining lane and it is expected that all lanes of the Warrego Highway will be open within the next few hours.

SITUATION OVERVIEW

1. Summary of operations since last report

PREVIOUS INFORMATION

Heavy rainfall has been experienced in the Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley. As a result flooding has been experienced in areas around Laidley and Gatton.

Lockyer Valley LDMG was activated at 0450hrs 27/12/2010.

1. A caravan being used as a residence at [REDACTED] Road, Junction View near Gatton has been washed away. There were unconfirmed reports that two persons were inside the van, but occupants have now been located safe and well.
2. A risk assessment is being conducted of the Black Duck Creek floodwater which is expected to reach Gatton overnight. At this stage it is not expected to cause major flooding in the Gatton area.
3. Laidley Creek has burst its banks near Mulgowie. River Height is 8.6m and rising fast. This is expected to reach the Warrego Highway during the night and may cause road closures of the Highway. All alternate routes are currently closed.
4. The lower areas of Laidley will be flooded this evening. Local authorities are currently conducting a risk assessment to determine the extent of flooding expected. SES and police are currently conducting door-knocks of those affected and are providing advice. No evacuations have been instructed at this time pending the risk assessment.
5. Sandy Creek upstream of Forest Hill has burst its banks. A risk assessment is being conducted as to the impact to the town of Forest Hill. A door-knock has been conducted of the low lying areas of Forest Hill and occupants are being provided with advice. No evacuations have been instructed at this time pending the risk assessment.

UPDATE 28/12/2010

LOCKYER VALLEY

- Levels in Lockyer Creek and Laidley Creek are receding, flood levels are receding down stream at Glenore Grove.
- No further rainfall has occurred and it is expected that flood waters will continue to recede. There are no further problems expected.

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- LDMG is in recovery mode.

MILLMERRAN

SITUATION OVERVIEW

Weather (Local observations)

On 10/1/11 at approx 1200 a severe rain occurred in Toowoomba and the Lockyer Valley. As a result of this event a number of persons were reported missing in flood waters, vehicles were submerged/washed away and dwellings and premises have received significant/major damage.

SITUATION OVERVIEW

Weather (Local observations)

On 10/1/11 at approx 1200 a severe rain occurred in Toowoomba and the Lockyer Valley. As a result of this event a number of persons were reported missing in flood waters, vehicles were submerged/washed away and dwellings and premises have received significant/major damage.

UPDATE 0300hrs 13/1/2011

1. Minor showers throughout the day has seen flood waters recede in the Lockyer Valley. Toowoomba has not experienced significant rainfall today.
2. Conditions are expected to improve tomorrow.
3. Regular weather analysis from BOM is being provided to staff in the field to ensure safety of personnel in the event of weather changes.
4. BOM predicts 1 – 5mm for day

UPDATE 1500 13/01/2011

1. Less than 1 mm rain today in the Toowoomba District, with a forecast of mostly fine for tomorrow.
2. Further complications from the weather are not anticipated.

UPDATE 0400 14/01/2011

1. Less than 1mm predicted.

UPDATE 1500 14/1/2011

UPDATE 1500hrs 15/1/2011

- Nil issues identified.

2. Damage assessment Overview (Include brief Summary of effects)

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1. Extensive damage has occurred within Lockyer Valley areas of Grantham, Laidley, Helidon, Withcott and Murphy's Creek areas. Inspection of most areas are unable to be completed due to isolation. It is known that residences have been washed away.

UPDATE 1500hrs 12/1/2011

2. Extensive damage has occurred to buildings, roads and infrastructure in all areas of the Lockyer Valley. Assessments are ongoing. Engineers are currently in the area conducting inspections of houses, roads, bridges and infrastructure.
3. Extensive damage has also occurred to buildings, roads and infrastructure within the Toowoomba CBD. Roads to affected areas remain close until buildings can be made safe.

3. Media Issues

UPDATE 10/1/2011

Severe weather conditions in Toowoomba today caused extensive and major flooding. Numerous cars and persons were affected by this floodwater. 1 x person is confirmed deceased as a result of vehicles having been washed away. Numerous other vehicle with unknown occupants remain unaccounted for. Several people (3 x children at Tomato-land, Lockyer Valley, and 2 x people from James St & Kitchener St, Toowoomba) remain unaccounted for.

UPDATE 11/1/2011

1. The flooding within Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley that occurred yesterday has generated a large amount of media interest.
2. All media inquiries have been forwarded to Police Media.
3. Numerous deceased persons are still to be recovered.
4. Phone number has been established for anyone who has family members missing. This number is 1300993191 and has been broadcast via local media.
5. Police Media have been informed of contact number and will broadcast throughout media outlets.
6. Extensive damage from flooding to areas within Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley which has been subject of extensive media coverage.

UPDATE 12/1/2011 2350hrs

1. Inquiries by distraught MP (Grave Concerns) [REDACTED] Grantham - reported by The Daily Telegraph and Adelaide Now as being "found by specialist disaster identification experts amid the mangled rubble of their home".
2. Review of IMS jobs 2011/01/1792 & 2011/01/2513 confirmed reports of MP calling police in rising water.
3. Inquiries confirm MP's still outstanding.
4. A/C briefed by Victim Liaison team at 2355.

UPDATE 1500hrs 13/1/2011

1. The death toll has risen to 14 from 12 today
2. The 2 deceased persons were located. 1 unidentified male at Goombungee and an unidentified male at Gatton.
3. Grave concerns held for a further 12 persons.
4. An additional 67 persons remain unaccounted. This includes 7 in the Ipswich District and 60 in Toowoomba District.

UPDATE 0400hrs 14/1/2011

1. Visit by Prime Minister 1000hrs depart RAAF base Amberley for Grantham (Blackhawk); 1130 Depart Grantham for Toowoomba (Blackhawk); 1200 arrive Toowoomba; 1400 depart Toowoomba.
2. Reports of Facebook page "RIP To All The Victims Of The Toowoomba Floods" together with distasteful images discovered. Information to Taskforce Argos for investigation with request for immediate removal of page.

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UPDATE 1500hrs 14/1/2011

1. Visit by Prime Minister to Grantham at 1000hrs and Toowoomba at 1200. Departure at 1400rs.
2. Ongoing search and recovery operations within the Lockyer Valley.
3. Lockyer Valley have advised that some media outlets are targetting evacuees and attempting to illicit negative comments.

UPDATE 0400hrs 16/01/2011

- 'Sunrise' undertaking live crosses from Murphy's Creek commencing 0600hrs 16/1/2011.

4. Summary Of Past 24 Hours By DDMG / LDMG / Region

(Include brief details of operations; visits, etc)

UPDATE 10/1/2011

Further heavy rainfall has occurred throughout Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley since Sunday 9/1/2011. Further severe rainfall has occurred today which has resulted in major flooding in both Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley.

TOOWOOMBA

- The Toowoomba LDMG has activated and a LDCC has been established.
- Confirmed reports of 5 vehicles having been washed away from the intersection of Russell and Neil Streets, Toowoomba into floodwater. 1 x deceased female person has been recovered near this location. The number of occupants of the vehicles is unknown.
- Confirmed reports of 2 x persons on foot having been washed away from the intersection of James and Kitchener Streets, Toowoomba. They have not been located.
- Numerous parked vehicles have been washed away into swollen waterways and reports have been received of extensive damage caused to infrastructure (bridges, street-lights etc) by these moving vehicles.
- Landslides have occurred on the Toowoomba Range completely blocking the Warrego Highway on the Range.
- Landslides have occurred on the New England Highway north of Toowoomba at Mt Kynoch. This has blocked the 2 x north bound lanes. The 2 x south bound lanes remain open and are being utilised as 1 x lane in either direction.
- 10 x houses in Jondaryan were threatened by rising floodwaters and were evacuated as a precaution. The majority of these persons self-evacuated, with 6 people staying at the Jondaryan Hall overnight. The houses were not inundated and all persons have returned home.

LOCKYER VALLEY

- The Lockyer Valley LDMG has activated.
- There are reports of houses having been washed away in Dianna Crescent, Postman's Ridge.
- There is a confirmed report of a house being washed away from [REDACTED] Murphy's Creek. It is unknown if any occupants were home at the time. There are separate unconfirmed reports of other houses being washed away and a report of 1 x person clinging to a tree. A landslide on Murphy's Creek Road is preventing access to this area, however work is being conducted to clear the roadway to enable swift water rescue crews to inspect the area.
- There are confirmed reports of 3 x children having been washed away in floodwaters at Tomatoland, Withcott. They have not been located. There are also confirmed reports of a Van having been washed away at this same location with unknown occupants.
- There are reports of a landslide occurring at the Withcott Water Reservoir and the associated pipeline having been washed away. This has not been confirmed.
- Laidley Creek is rising fast and door knocking has commenced to inform affected residents. Sandy

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Creek at Forest Hill is rising fast and a door knock has commenced to inform affected residents.

- There are reports that Black Duck Creek has burst its banks. This floodwater will flow into Lockyer Creek which is expected to cause major flooding at Grantham. A door knock has commenced to inform affected residents.
- Several houses in Grantham have been inundated with floodwater and numerous occupants have sought safety on their rooftops.
- Helicopter support has been achieved by QFRS through SDCC.
- A request for further helicopter support for Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley has been sought.
- Sandy Creek is rising as it heads towards Forest Hill. The LDMG is monitoring Sandy Creek to determine if any evacuations will be required.

UPDATE 11/1/2011

LOCKYER VALLEY

- Plans for search and rescue of affected areas from yesterday's rainfall were put in place to commence at 6:30am eventide. Helicopter assistance was sought and arrived, however due to consistent rainfall these attempts have been hampered significantly.
- Evacuations have commenced at Forest Hill to the School of Arts and to the Forest Hill State School. People at the School of Arts are being airlifted to higher ground at Gatton due to rising floodwater.
- Further evacuations have occurred at Laidley. Persons have been evacuated to either the Laidley Hospital or the Laidley Works Depot dependant upon which point residents can access.
- The exact numbers at evacuation centres is unknown as evacuations are still occurring.
- A Forward Command Post has been established at Gatton Police Station dealing with matters at Forest Hill, Grantham and wider Gatton community.
- A Forward Command Post has been established at Murphy's Creek State School with respect to matters at Murphy's Creek and Withcott.
- 9 x confirmed deceased have been located and retrieved. These deceased persons have been lodged at either the Gatton or Toowoomba Mortuaries. A further 1 x deceased person is in the process of being recovered from Murphy's Creek area.
- Consistent rainfall is continuing in the Lockyer Valley and is continuing to hamper search and recovery efforts.

TOOWOOMBA

- Oakey has experienced significant rises in Oakey Creek resulting in homes being inundated.
- Numerous persons have been evacuated and the Toowoomba LDMG has established an evacuation centre within Oakey. Toowoomba LDMG has since moved these evacuees from Oakey to Toowoomba Grammar School via bus transport.
- Approximately 20 x houses have been inundated within Oakey township.
- The water is approximately 1 metre over the main bridge and falling.
- RFA's have been sent regarding helicopter deployments to Jondaryan area regarding reports of stranded residents on rooftops and also persons being stuck on top of a semi-trailer in floodwaters.

UPDATE 1500hrs 12/1/2011

- Search and recovery efforts have commenced within the areas of Grantham and Murphy's Creek.
- Road access to many areas is now possible. Floodwaters in creek systems have decreased but are still flowing making efforts to locate any deceased persons difficult.
- Searches of badly damaged residences have commenced with the assistance of earthmoving equipment.
- Recovery and repatriation efforts have commenced within LDMG areas of Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley.
- Repatriation of evacuees to all centres within the Lockyer Valley and Toowoomba Evacuations Centres has been occurring throughout today.
- The numbers at Toowoomba Evacuation Centre are expected to decline dramatically to approximately 40 people.
- The numbers of evacuees within the Lockyer Valley is also expected to decline dramatically today however the exact number of remaining evacuees cannot be determined at this time due to inspections still occurring of some localities. Longer term evacuees will be housed at the Gatton Evacuation Centre.

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- Road Closures in Toowoomba CBD remain in some areas due to damage to buildings and infrastructure.
- Confirmed 12 x deceased.
- Grave concerns are held for a further 11 people.
- A further 40 persons are presently unaccounted for and their whereabouts remains unknown.

UPDATE 0400hrs 13/1/2011

- MIR and DDC manned overnight.
- Efforts by Victim Liaison investigators continued.

UPDATE 1500hrs 13/1/2011

- Helidon has run out of drinkable water.
- Gatton is expected to run out of water in the next few hours.
- Arrangements have been put in place for water couriers to cart potable water into all areas of the Lockyer Valley commencing immediately. Couriers have been sourced from the Lockyer Valley, Toowoomba and Warwick areas.
- Main Roads have been contacted and increased the weight limit to 20 tonnes at the Helidon bridge.
- The Defence Force have commenced carriage of water to the Lockyer Valley from Amberley with one truck. Further 4 trucks are envisaged to be operating AM on 14/1/11.
- The purchase of 65000litres of water storage tanks has been authorized and is in the process of being placed at Withcott Fire Station for distributing potable water for residents.
- Lockyer Valley LDCC will prioritise and distribute the water.
- Power supply to Grantham has been re-established.

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- 2140hrs 13/1/11 confirmed by LV LDMG – [REDACTED] (Water Carrier Coord) advised that 10 trucks were currently operating loading water in Tmba and filling reservoirs with another 16 trucks to arrive in next 24hrs. Load restrictions caused by load limits on Warrego Highway are under consideration by TMR.
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- RFA regarding 60K water bottles being priorities by SDCC.
- Concern by LV LDMG re electricity provision. Representations to Energex confirmed that power restored to Grantham 13/1/1; 95% of those affected will have power restored by PM 14/1; Options for generators being explored however load limits and damage to roads in isolated areas provides access issue.
- QPS & ADF with thermal imaging and night vision performing security of Grantham area overnight.
- STSB with 2 x RDTU to take over traffic control on Gatton Helidon Road 14/1/11.
- Security patrols of Murphy's Creek and Grantham continue. ADF assistance including thermal imaging at Grantham.

UPDATE 1500 14/1/2011

- The death toll has risen to 15 following the discovery of a deceased person at Grantham. Due to the state of decomposition the sex of the deceased cannot be determined at this stage.
- Searches were completed of all houses in Grantham and the cars at the railway bridge late on 13/1/2011.
- The focus today has been on the yards and debris in paddocks adjacent to the railway bridge area.
- It is anticipated that the total search of Grantham township will be completed by the afternoon of 15/1/2011.
- Searches have also continued in Murphy's Creek area.
- The search of the watercourse from Spring Bluff to Grantham is anticipated that this will be completed by the afternoon of 15/1/2011.
- Arrangements have been made for USAR inspectors to commence inspections of houses in Grantham under police supervision, that have been searched in efforts to render them safe and allow recovery and cleanup efforts to commence as soon as possible.
- A police community liaison officer has been appointed to interact with the community and address concerns in the lead up to people returning to their communities.
- Energex advise that it is anticipated that power will be restored to approximately 95% of the affected

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areas of the Lockyer Valley by the afternoon of 14/1/2011.

- The primary concerns with respect to water in the Lockyer Valley are in Gatton, Grantham, Helidon and Withcott.
- Gatton has insufficient supply and is effectively out of water. Bottled water is being transported to Gatton and distributed to residents on a 'ration' basis.
- QUU have advised at 1400hrs today that it is anticipated that the Lowood Water Treatment Plant which is controlled by SEQ Water will commence operations at approximately 1600hrs today. This plant will then commence to pump water to the Lockyer Valley in addition to Lowood and Fernvale areas.
- It is anticipated that water will be restored to Gatton, Lowood, Fernvale, Grantham and Helidon areas by midnight tonight.
- The restoration to other areas of Withcott, Murphy's Creek and Tabletop areas is anticipated to be completed by the afternoon of 15/1/2011. This is dependant upon repair to the Helidon pump station
- The water supply to Laidley and Forest Hill is low but there is sufficient supply until the water treatment plant comes on line.
- There are currently 16 trucks operating and this is expected to be 26 by the end of today.
- Bottled water continues to be distributed throughout the Lockyer Valley and will remain so until the water treatment plant becomes operational in all areas.
- Water tanks have been established in Withcott which are being filled by water truck. This water is being dispersed to the community in addition to bottled water also being distributed in Withcott and Murphy's Creek.
- An audit is being conducted of residents in the isolated Mt Sylvia area of the Lockyer Valley to determine the number of residents isolated. The LDMG will then assess the prospects of re-supply and/or evacuation due to access to this area possibly being cut for an extended period of up to 6 months due to river crossing having been washed away.
- Cecil Plains remains isolated however Toowoomba LDMG is re-supplying this area through a privately sourced helicopter operator.

UPDATE 0400 15/1/2011

- The diesel water pumps planned for use at the Lowood water treatment plant have not become operational due to connection and mounting failures.
- [REDACTED] of SEQ water [REDACTED] has advised that every efforts is being made to bring these units into service asap. It is expected that they will be in service by 15/1/11 PM.
- Water trucks continue to cart water to supply towers as a contingency.
- Bottled water is being transported to Gatton and distributed to residents on a 'ration' basis.
- Efforts to locate additional generators through the Department of Communities Recovery Assistance program are continuing.
- Community newsletters and Emergency Alerts requested to advise residents of Gatton to restrict water usage to drinking only and to boil water prior to drinking.
- Request for bulk hand sanitizer made for distribution throughout area to mitigate possible gastroenteritis outbreaks. (Small outbreak reported in Grantham area 14/1/11).
- Briefings to occur 15/1/11 0830 between Field commander and LV LDMG and USAR regarding recovery phase.

UPDATE 1500hrs 15/1/2011

- Backup diesel pumps at the Lowood Water Treatment Plant have become operational and are supplying water at a rate of 140 litres per second.
- The reservoirs within the Lockyer Valley are now receiving water and will continue to gain volume during the day.
- The backup pump will continue around the clock until the restoration of the main electric pump which is not anticipated to occur until late next week.
- Once the volumes of water in the reservoirs increases there will be sufficient water to supply the affected areas of Gatton, Laidley, Forest Hill, Grantham and Helidon areas.
- Trucks are continuing to cart water and bottled water is being supplied to these affected areas with priority to Withcott and Murphy's Creek areas until all areas have sufficient water supplies.
- Energex has 44 crews working to restore electricity throughout the affected areas. It is expected to be returned progressively over the next two days. Power supply to Murphy's Creek remains the major issue with only 20% of power restored and major infrastructure damage sustained. All Energex crews

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within the Lockyer Valley will attend Murphy's Creek when finished immediate duties to focus on this area.

- The DDC Toowoomba together with the Assistant Commissioner, Southern Region, Mayor Lockyer Valley [REDACTED] Minister for Police and Commissioner Atkinson attended the Community Recovery Forum held at the Grantham State School to discuss concerns regarding the recovery of the community. A further Community Recovery Forum is being held at Helidon at 1430hours 15/01/2011. All the above mentioned persons are now attending this meeting.
- Search and recovery operations to continue in affected areas. Ground search west of Grantham is continuing.
- Tetanus vaccinations have arrived at the Gatton Hospital and a clinic will operate on 16/01/2011 between 1400 hours and 1700 hours.
- Death toll stands at 15. Total missing persons is at 21. Grave fears are held for 11 of these.

UPDATE 0400hrs 16/01/2011

- Clean up continues in Toowoomba CBD and Oakey.
- Confirmation received of alternative FCP when Grantham completed. Approval given by Director of Property & Facilities at UQ Gatton for FCP at UQ Gatton. Contact is [REDACTED] on [REDACTED]
- Police divers located vehicle of MP [REDACTED] in Lockyer Creek near Trost Street, Helidon at 1700hrs 15/1/2011. Investigation commenced by Toowoomba CIB.
- PFC at Murphy's Creek terminated.
- Searches continued in the Grantham area including divers searching Lockyer Creek.
- ADF have completed 30% of foot search of flood course towards Brisbane River.
- A/Supt Marcus appointed Liaison Officer to Grantham community and held meeting at Grantham Primary School.

SITUATION OVERVIEW

Weather (Local observations)

On 10/1/11 at approx 1200 a severe rain occurred in Toowoomba and the Lockyer Valley. As a result of this event a number of persons were reported missing in flood waters, vehicles were submerged/washed away and dwellings and premises have received significant/major damage.

UPDATE 0300hrs 13/1/2011

1. Minor showers throughout the day has seen flood waters recede in the Lockyer Valley. Toowoomba has not experienced significant rainfall today.
2. Conditions are expected to improve tomorrow.
3. Regular weather analysis from BOM is being provided to staff in the field to ensure safety of personnel in the event of weather changes.
4. BOM predicts 1 – 5mm for day

UPDATE 1500 13/01/2011

1. Less than 1 mm rain today in the Toowoomba District, with a forecast of mostly fine for tomorrow.
2. Further complications from the weather are not anticipated.

UPDATE 0400 14/01/2011

1. Less than 1mm predicted.

UPDATE 1500 14/1/2011

UPDATE 1500hrs 16/1/2011

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2. Damage assessment Overview*(Include brief Summary of effects)*

1. Extensive damage has occurred within Lockyer Valley areas of Grantham, Laidley, Helidon, Withcott and Murphy's Creek areas. Inspection of most areas are unable to be completed due to isolation. It is known that residences have been washed away.

UPDATE 1500hrs 12/1/2011

2. Extensive damage has occurred to buildings, roads and infrastructure in all areas of the Lockyer Valley. Assessments are ongoing. Engineers are currently in the area conducting inspections of houses, roads, bridges and infrastructure.
3. Extensive damage has also occurred to buildings, roads and infrastructure within the Toowoomba CBD. Roads to affected areas remain close until buildings can be made safe.

Media Issues*(include brief details of any media related issues)*

UPDATE 10/1/2011

Severe weather conditions in Toowoomba today caused extensive and major flooding. Numerous cars and persons were affected by this floodwater. 1 x person is confirmed deceased as a result of vehicles having been washed away. Numerous other vehicle with unknown occupants remain unaccounted for. Several people (3 x children at Tomato-land, Lockyer Valley, and 2 x people from James St & Kitchener St, Toowoomba) remain unaccounted for.

UPDATE 11/1/2011

1. The flooding within Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley that occurred yesterday has generated a large amount of media interest.
2. All media inquiries have been forwarded to Police Media.
3. Numerous deceased persons are still to be recovered.
4. Phone number has been established for anyone who has family members missing. This number is 1300993191 and has been broadcast via local media.
5. Police Media have been informed of contact number and will broadcast throughout media outlets.
6. Extensive damage from flooding to areas within Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley which has been subject of extensive media coverage.

UPDATE 12/1/2011 2350hrs

1. Inquiries by distraught MP (Grave Concerns) [REDACTED] Grantham - reported by The Daily Telegraph and Adelaide Now as being "found by specialist disaster identification experts amid the mangled rubble of their home".

1. Visit by Prime Minister to Grantham at 1000hrs and Toowoomba at 1200. Departure at 1400rs.
2. Ongoing search and recovery operations within the Lockyer Valley.

4. Summary Of Past 24 Hours By DDMG / LDMG / Region

UPDATE 10/1/2011

Further heavy rainfall has occurred throughout Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley since Sunday 9/1/2011. Further severe rainfall has occurred today which has resulted in major flooding in both Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley.

TOOWOOMBAA

- The Toowoomba LDMG has activated and a LDCC has been established.
- Confirmed reports of 5 vehicles having been washed away from the intersection of Russell and Neil Streets, Toowoomba into floodwater. 1 x deceased female person has been recovered near this location. The number of occupants of the vehicles is unknown.
- Confirmed reports of 2 x persons on foot having been washed away from the intersection of James and Kitchener Streets, Toowoomba. They have not been located.
- Numerous parked vehicles have been washed away into swollen waterways and reports have been received of extensive damage caused to infrastructure (bridges, street-lights etc) by these moving vehicles.
- Landslides have occurred on the Toowoomba Range completely blocking the Warrego Highway on the Range.
- Landslides have occurred on the New England Highway north of Toowoomba at Mt Kynoch. This has blocked the 2 x north bound lanes. The 2 x south bound lanes remain open and are being utilised as 1 x lane in either direction.
- 10 x houses in Jondaryan were threatened by rising floodwaters and were evacuated as a precaution. The majority of these persons self-evacuated, with 6 people staying at the Jondaryan Hall overnight. The houses were not inundated and all persons have returned home.

LOCKYER VALLEY

- The Lockyer Valley LDMG has activated.
- There are reports of houses having been washed away in Dianna Crescent, Postman's Ridge.
- There is a confirmed report of a house being washed away from [REDACTED] Murphy's Creek. It is unknown if any occupants were home at the time. There are separate unconfirmed reports of other houses being washed away and a report of 1 x person clinging to a tree. A landslide

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on Murphy's Creek Road is preventing access to this area, however work is being conducted to clear the roadway to enable swift water rescue crews to inspect the area.

- There are confirmed reports of 3 x children having been washed away in floodwaters at Tomatoland, Withcott. They have not been located. There are also confirmed reports of a Van having been washed away at this same location with unknown occupants.
- There are reports of a landslide occurring at the Withcott Water Reservoir and the associated pipeline having been washed away. This has not been confirmed.
- Laidley Creek is rising fast and door knocking has commenced to inform affected residents. Sandy Creek at Forest Hill is rising fast and a door knock has commenced to inform affected residents.
- There are reports that Black Duck Creek has burst its banks. This floodwater will flow into Lockyer Creek which is expected to cause major flooding at Grantham. A door knock has commenced to inform affected residents.
- Several houses in Grantham have been inundated with floodwater and numerous occupants have sought safety on their rooftops.
- Helicopter support has been achieved by QFRS through SDCC.
- A request for further helicopter support for Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley has been sought.
- Sandy Creek is rising as it heads towards Forest Hill. The LDMG is monitoring Sandy Creek to determine if any evacuations will be required.

UPDATE 11/1/2011

LOCKYER VALLEY

- Plans for search and rescue of affected areas from yesterday's rainfall were put in place to commence at 6:30am even date. Helicopter assistance was sought and arrived, however due to consistent rainfall these attempts have been hampered significantly.
- Evacuations have commenced at Forest Hill to the School of Arts and to the Forest Hill State School. People at the School of Arts are being airlifted to higher ground at Gatton due to rising floodwater.
- Further evacuations have occurred at Laidley. Persons have been evacuated to either the Laidley Hospital or the Laidley Works Depot dependant upon which point residents can access.
- The exact numbers at evacuation centres is unknown as evacuations are still occurring.
- A Forward Command Post has been established at Gatton Police Station dealing with matters at Forest Hill, Grantham and wider Gatton community.
- A Forward Command Post has been established at Murphy's Creek State School with respect to matters at Murphy's Creek and Withcott.
- 9 x confirmed deceased have been located and retrieved. These deceased persons have been lodged at either the Gatton or Toowoomba Mortuaries. A further 1 x deceased person is in the process of being recovered from Murphy's Creek area.
- Consistent rainfall is continuing in the Lockyer Valley and is continuing to hamper search and recovery efforts.

TOOWOOMB

- Oakey has experienced significant rises in Oakey Creek resulting in homes being inundated.
- Numerous persons have been evacuated and the Toowoomba LDMG has established an evacuation centre within Oakey. Toowoomba LDMG has since moved these evacuees from Oakey to Toowoomba Grammar School via bus transport.
- Approximately 20 x houses have been inundated within Oakey township.
- The water is approximately 1 metre over the main bridge and falling.
- RFA's have been sent regarding helicopter deployments to Jondaryan area regarding reports of stranded residents on rooftops and also persons being stuck on top of a semi-trailer in floodwaters.

UPDATE 1500hrs 12/1/2011

- Search and recovery efforts have commenced within the areas of Grantham and Murphy's Creek.
- Road access to many areas is now possible. Floodwaters in creek systems have decreased but are still flowing making efforts to locate any deceased persons difficult.
- Searches of badly damaged residences have commenced with the assistance of earthmoving equipment.
- Recovery and repatriation efforts have commenced within LDMG areas of Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley.

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- Repatriation of evacuees to all centres within the Lockyer Valley and Toowoomba Evacuations Centres has been occurring throughout today.
- The numbers at Toowoomba Evacuation Centre are expected to decline dramatically to approximately 40 people.
- The numbers of evacuees within the Lockyer Valley is also expected to decline dramatically today however the exact number of remaining evacuees cannot be determined at this time due to inspections still occurring of some localities. Longer term evacuees will be housed at the Gatton Evacuation Centre.
- Road Closures in Toowoomba CBD remain in some areas due to damage to buildings and infrastructure.
- Confirmed 12 x deceased.
- Grave concerns are held for a further 11 people.
- A further 40 persons are presently unaccounted for and their whereabouts remains unknown.

UPDATE 0400hrs 13/1/2011

- MIR and DDC manned overnight.
- Efforts by Victim Liaison investigators continued.

UPDATE 1500hrs 13/1/2011

- Helidon has run out of drinkable water.
- Gatton is expected to run out of water in the next few hours.
- Arrangements have been put in place for water couriers to cart potable water into all areas of the Lockyer Valley commencing immediately. Couriers have been sourced from the Lockyer Valley, Toowoomba and Warwick areas.
- Main Roads have been contacted and increased the weight limit to 20 tonnes at the Helidon bridge.
- The Defence Force have commenced carriage of water to the Lockyer Valley from Amberley with one truck. Further 4 trucks are envisaged to be operating AM on 14/1/11.
- The purchase of 65000litres of water storage tanks has been authorized and is in the process of being placed at Withcott Fire Station for distributing potable water for residents.
- Lockyer Valley LDCC will prioritise and distribute the water.
- Power supply to Grantham has been re-established.

UPDATE 0400hrs 14/1/2011

- 2140hrs 13/1/11 confirmed by LV LDMG – [REDACTED] (Water Carrier Coord) advised that 10 trucks were currently operating loading water in Tmba and filling reservoirs with another 16 trucks to arrive in next 24hrs. Load restrictions caused by load limits on Warrego Highway are under consideration by TMR.
- Diesel Fuel as been arranged at Caltex SS James and Stephen Streets Toowoomba
- RFA regarding 60K water bottles being priorities by SDCC.
- Concern by LV LDMG re electricity provision. Representations to Energex confirmed that power restored to Grantham 13/1/1; 95% of those affected will have power restored by PM 14/1; Options for generators being explored however load limits and damage to roads in isolated areas provides access issue.
- QPS & ADF with thermal imaging and night vision performing security of Grantham area overnight.
- STSB with 2 x RDTU to take over traffic control on Gatton Helidon Road 14/1/11.
- Security patrols of Murphy's Creek and Grantham continue. ADF assistance including thermal imaging at Grantham.

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- The focus today has been on the yards and debris in paddocks adjacent to the railway bridge area.
- It is anticipated that the total search of Grantham township will be completed by the afternoon of 15/1/2011.
- Searches have also continued in Murphy's Creek area.

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- The search of the watercourse from Spring Bluff to Grantham is anticipated that this will be completed by the afternoon of 15/1/2011.
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- Gatton has insufficient supply and is effectively out of water. Bottled water is being transported to Gatton and distributed to residents on a 'ration' basis.
- QUU have advised at 1400hrs today that it is anticipated that the Lowood Water Treatment Plant which is controlled by SEQ Water will commence operations at approximately 1600hrs today. This plant will then commence to pump water to the Lockyer Valley in addition to Lowood and Fernvale areas.
- It is anticipated that water will be restored to Gatton, Lowood, Fernvale, Grantham and Helidon areas by midnight tonight.
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- Cecil Plains remains isolated however Toowoomba LDMG is re-supplying this area through a privately sourced helicopter operator.

DATE 0400 15/1/2011

- The diesel water pumps planned for use at the Lowood water treatment plant have not become operational due to connection and mounting failures.
- [REDACTED] of SEQ water [REDACTED] has advised that every effort is being made to bring these units into service asap. It is expected that they will be in service by 15/1/11 PM.
- Water trucks continue to cart water to supply towers as a contingency.
- Bottled water is being transported to Gatton and distributed to residents on a 'ration' basis.
- Efforts to locate additional generators through the Department of Communities Recovery Assistance program are continuing.
- Community newsletters and Emergency Alerts requested to advise residents of Gatton to restrict water usage to drinking only and to boil water prior to drinking.
- Request for bulk hand sanitizer made for distribution throughout area to mitigate possible gastroenteritis outbreaks. (Small outbreak reported in Grantham area 14/1/11).
- Briefings to occur 15/1/11 0830 between Field commander and LV LDMG and USAR regarding recovery phase.

UPDATE 1500hrs 15/1/2011

- Back up diesel pumps at the Lowood Water Treatment Plant have become operational and are supplying water at a rate of 140 litres per second.
- The reservoirs within the Lockyer Valley are now receiving water and will continue to gain volume during the day.
- The backup pump will continue around the clock until the restoration of the main electric pump which

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is not anticipated to occur until late next week.

- Once the volumes of water in the reservoirs increases there will be sufficient water to supply the affected areas of Gatton, Laidley, Forest Hill, Grantham and Helidon areas.
- Trucks are continuing to cart water and bottled water is being supplied to these affected areas with priority to Withcott and Murphy's Creek areas until all areas have sufficient water supplies.
- Energex has 44 crews working to restore electricity throughout the affected areas. It is expected to be returned progressively over the next two days. Power supply to Murphy's Creek remains the major issue with only 20% of power restored and major infrastructure damage sustained. All Energex crews within the Lockyer Valley will attend Murphy's Creek when finished immediate duties to focus on this area.
- The DDC Toowoomba together with the Assistant Commissioner, Southern Region, Mayor Lockyer Valley [REDACTED] Minister for Police and Commissioner Atkinson attended the Community Recovery Forum held at the Grantham State School to discuss concerns regarding the recovery of the community. A further Community Recovery Forum is being held at Helidon at 1430hours 15/01/2011. All the above mentioned persons are now attending this meeting.
- Search and recovery operations to continue in affected areas. Ground search west of Grantham is continuing.
- Tetanus vaccinations have arrived at the Gatton Hospital and a clinic will operate on 16/01/2011 between 1400 hours and 1700 hours.
- Death toll stands at 15. Total missing persons is at 21. Grave fears are held for 11 of these.

UPDATE 0400hrs 16/01/2011

- Clean up continues in Toowoomba CBD and Oakey.
- Confirmation received of alternative FCP when Grantham completed. Approval given by Director of Property & Facilities at UQ Gatton for FCP at UQ Gatton. Contact is [REDACTED]
- Police divers located vehicle of MP [REDACTED] in Lockyer Creek near Trost Street, Helidon at 1700hrs 15/1/2011. Investigation commenced by Toowoomba CIB.
- PFC at Murphy's Creek terminated.
- Searches continued in the Grantham area including divers searching Lockyer Creek.
- ADF have completed 30% of foot search of flood course towards Brisbane River.
- A/Supt Marcus appointed Liaison Officer to Grantham community and held meeting at Grantham Primary School.

UPDATE 1500hrs 16/01/2011

- The DDC Toowoomba and Assistant Commissioner, Southern Region have attended Community Recovery Forums at Helidon at 1000hours and Grantham at 1330hours to discuss repatriation and associated issues.
- The permanent commissioned officers appointed as Police Liaison for the Helidon and Grantham areas have been introduced to the community and will remain there until repatriation occurs. These officers are Inspector Mike CROWLEY for Helidon and A/Supt Ben MARCUS for Grantham.
- A permanent police presence has been established at the Grantham PCFC prior to repatriation occurring. This presence will remain until it is no longer required.
- Searching has continued in Grantham, with 1 deceased adult female being located.
- Searching by divers is also continuing.
- All evacuees at the Toowoomba Grammar School are expected to leave in the next 24 hours.
- Most residents and businesses in the Lockyer Valley are now receiving water as reservoirs continue to fill. Urban utilities recommend boiling drinking water or using bottled water. Bottled water collection points exist at Gatton, Withcott, Helidon and Laidley.
- Urban utilities are still working on Grantham and Withcott water supply due to reservoir and infrastructure damage, while continuing to transport water to the allocated storage points.

SITUATION OVERVIEW



Weather

(Local observations)

On 10/1/11 at approx 1200 a severe rain occurred in Toowoomba and the Lockyer Valley. As a result of this event a number of persons were reported missing in flood waters, vehicles were submerged/washed away and dwellings and premises have received significant/major damage.

UPDATE 0300hrs 13/1/2011

1. Minor showers throughout the day has seen flood waters recede in the Lockyer Valley. Toowoomba has not experienced significant rainfall today.
2. Conditions are expected to improve tomorrow.
3. Regular weather analysis from BOM is being provided to staff in the field to ensure safety of personnel in the event of weather changes.
4. BOM predicts 1 – 5mm for day

UPDATE 1500 13/01/2011

1. Less than 1 mm rain today in the Toowoomba District, with a forecast of mostly fine for tomorrow.
2. Further complications from the weather are not anticipated.

2. Damage assessment Overview*(Include brief Summary of effects)*

1. Extensive damage has occurred within Lockyer Valley areas of Grantham, Laidley, Helidon, Withcott and Murphy's Creek areas. Inspection of most areas are unable to be completed due to isolation. It is known that residences have been washed away.

UPDATE 1500hrs 12/1/2011

2. Extensive damage has occurred to buildings, roads and infrastructure in all areas of the Lockyer Valley. Assessments are ongoing. Engineers are currently in the area conducting inspections of houses, roads, bridges and infrastructure.
3. Extensive damage has also occurred to buildings, roads and infrastructure within the Toowoomba CBD. Roads to affected areas remain close until buildings can be made safe.

3. Media Issues*(Include brief details of any media related issues)***UPDATE 10/1/2011**

Severe weather conditions in Toowoomba today caused extensive and major flooding. Numerous cars and persons were affected by this floodwater. 1 x person is confirmed deceased as a result of vehicles having been washed away. Numerous other vehicle with unknown occupants remain unaccounted for. Several people (3 x children at Tomato-land, Lockyer Valley, and 2 x people from James St & Kitchener St, Toowoomba) remain unaccounted for.

UPDATE 11/1/2011

1. The flooding within Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley that occurred yesterday has generated a large amount of media interest.
2. All media inquiries have been forwarded to Police Media.
3. Numerous deceased persons are still to be recovered.
4. Phone number has been established for anyone who has family members missing. This number is 1300993191 and has been broadcast via local media.
5. Police Media have been informed of contact number and will broadcast throughout media outlets.

UPDATE 0400hrs 17/01/2011**REGIONAL REPORTS****4. Summary Of Past 24 Hours By DDMG / LDMG / Region***(Include brief details of operations; visits, etc)***UPDATE 10/1/2011**

Further heavy rainfall has occurred throughout Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley since Sunday 9/1/2011. Further severe rainfall has occurred today which has resulted in major flooding in both Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley.

TOOWOOMB

- The Toowoomba LDMG has activated and a LDCC has been established.
- Confirmed reports of 5 vehicles having been washed away from the intersection of Russell and Neil Streets, Toowoomba into floodwater. 1 x deceased female person has been recovered near this location. The number of occupants of the vehicles is unknown.
- Confirmed reports of 2 x persons on foot having been washed away from the intersection of James and Kitchener Streets, Toowoomba. They have not been located.
- Numerous parked vehicles have been washed away into swollen waterways and reports have been received of extensive damage caused to infrastructure (bridges, street-lights etc) by these moving vehicles.
- Landslides have occurred on the Toowoomba Range completely blocking the Warrego Highway on the Range.
- Landslides have occurred on the New England Highway north of Toowoomba at Mt Kynoch. This has blocked the 2 x north bound lanes. The 2 x south bound lanes remain open and are being utilised as 1 x lane in either direction.
- 10 x houses in Jondaryan were threatened by rising floodwaters and were evacuated as a precaution. The majority of these persons self-evacuated, with 6 people staying at the Jondaryan Hall overnight. The houses were not inundated and all persons have returned home.

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LOCKYER VALLEY

- The Lockyer Valley LDMG has activated.
- There are reports of houses having been washed away in Dianna Crescent, Postman's Ridge.
- There is a confirmed report of a house being washed away from [REDACTED] Murphy's Creek. It is unknown if any occupants were home at the time. There are separate unconfirmed reports of other houses being washed away and a report of 1 x person clinging to a tree. A landslide on Murphy's Creek Road is preventing access to this area, however work is being conducted to clear the roadway to enable swift water rescue crews to inspect the area.
- There are confirmed reports of 3 x children having been washed away in floodwaters at Tomatoland, Withcott. They have not been located. There are also confirmed reports of a Van having been washed away at this same location with unknown occupants.
- There are reports of a landslide occurring at the Withcott Water Reservoir and the associated pipeline having been washed away. This has not been confirmed.
- Laidley Creek is rising fast and door knocking has commenced to inform affected residents. Sandy Creek at Forest Hill is rising fast and a door knock has commenced to inform affected residents.
- There are reports that Black Duck Creek has burst its banks. This floodwater will flow into Lockyer Creek which is expected to cause major flooding at Grantham. A door knock has commenced to inform affected residents.
- Several houses in Grantham have been inundated with floodwater and numerous occupants have sought safety on their rooftops.
- Helicopter support has been achieved by QFRS through SDCC.
- A request for further helicopter support for Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley has been sought.
- Sandy Creek is rising as it heads towards Forest Hill. The LDMG is monitoring Sandy Creek to determine if any evacuations will be required.

UPDATE 11/1/2011

LOCKYER VALLEY

- Plans for search and rescue of affected areas from yesterday's rainfall were put in place to commence at 6:30am eventide. Helicopter assistance was sought and arrived, however due to consistent rainfall these attempts have been hampered significantly.
- Evacuations have commenced at Forest Hill to the School of Arts and to the Forest Hill State School. People at the School of Arts are being airlifted to higher ground at Gatton due to rising floodwater.
- Further evacuations have occurred at Laidley. Persons have been evacuated to either the Laidley Hospital or the Laidley Works Depot dependant upon which point residents can access.
- The exact numbers at evacuation centres is unknown as evacuations are still occurring.
- A Forward Command Post has been established at Gatton Police Station dealing with matters at Forest Hill, Grantham and wider Gatton community.
- A Forward Command Post has been established at Murphy's Creek State School with respect to matters at Murphy's Creek and Withcott.
- 9 x confirmed deceased have been located and retrieved. These deceased persons have been lodged at either the Gatton or Toowoomba Mortuaries. A further 1 x deceased person is in the process of being recovered from Murphy's Creek area.
- Consistent rainfall is continuing in the Lockyer Valley and is continuing to hamper search and recovery efforts.

TOOWOOMB

- Oakey has experienced significant rises in Oakey Creek resulting in homes being inundated.
- Numerous persons have been evacuated and the Toowoomba LDMG has established an evacuation centre within Oakey. Toowoomba LDMG has since moved these evacuees from Oakey to Toowoomba Grammar School via bus transport.
- Approximately 20 x houses have been inundated within Oakey township.
- The water is approximately 1 metre over the main bridge and falling.
- RFA's have been sent regarding helicopter deployments to Jondaryan area regarding reports of stranded residents on rooftops and also persons being stuck on top of a semi-trailer in floodwaters.

UPDATE 1500hrs 12/1/2011

- Search and recovery efforts have commenced within the areas of Grantham and Murphy's Creek.

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- Road access to many areas is now possible. Floodwaters in creek systems have decreased but are still flowing making efforts to locate any deceased persons difficult.
- Searches of badly damaged residences have commenced with the assistance of earthmoving equipment.
- Recovery and repatriation efforts have commenced within LDMG areas of Toowoomba and Lockyer Valley.
- Repatriation of evacuees to all centres within the Lockyer Valley and Toowoomba Evacuations Centres has been occurring throughout today.
- The numbers at Toowoomba Evacuation Centre are expected to decline dramatically to approximately 40 people.
- The numbers of evacuees within the Lockyer Valley is also expected to decline dramatically today however the exact number of remaining evacuees cannot be determined at this time due to inspections still occurring of some localities. Longer term evacuees will be housed at the Gatton Evacuation Centre.
- Road Closures in Toowoomba CBD remain in some areas due to damage to buildings and infrastructure.
- Confirmed 12 x deceased.
- Grave concerns are held for a further 11 people.
- A further 40 persons are presently unaccounted for and their whereabouts remains unknown.

UPDATE 0400hrs 13/1/2011

- MIR and DDC manned overnight.
- Efforts by Victim Liaison investigators continued.

UPDATE 1500hrs 13/1/2011

- Helidon has run out of drinkable water.
- Gatton is expected to run out of water in the next few hours.
- Arrangements have been put in place for water couriers to cart potable water into all areas of the Lockyer Valley commencing immediately. Couriers have been sourced from the Lockyer Valley, Toowoomba and Warwick areas.
- Main Roads have been contacted and increased the weight limit to 20 tonnes at the Helidon bridge.
- The Defence Force have commenced carriage of water to the Lockyer Valley from Amberley with one truck. Further 4 trucks are envisaged to be operating AM on 14/1/11.
- The purchase of 65000litres of water storage tanks has been authorized and is in the process of being placed at Withcott Fire Station for distributing potable water for residents.
- Lockyer Valley LDCC will prioritise and distribute the water.
- Power supply to Grantham has been re-established.

UPDATE 0400hrs 14/1/2011

- 2140hrs 13/1/11 confirmed by LV LDMG – [REDACTED] (Water Carrier Coord) advised that 10 trucks were currently operating loading water in Tmba and filling reservoirs with another 16 trucks to arrive in next 24hrs. Load restrictions caused by load limits on Warrego Highway are under consideration by TMR.
- Diesel Fuel as been arranged at Caltex SS James and Stephen Streets Toowoomba
- RFA regarding 60K water bottles being priorities by SDCC.
- Concern by LV LDMG re electricity provision. Representations to Energex confirmed that power restored to Grantham 13/1/1; 95% of those affected will have power restored by PM 14/1; Options for generators being explored however load limits and damage to roads in isolated areas provides access issue.
- QPS & ADF with thermal imaging and night vision performing security of Grantham area overnight.
- STSB with 2 x RDTU to take over traffic control on Gatton Helidon Road 14/1/11.
- Security patrols of Murphy's Creek and Grantham continue. ADF assistance including thermal imaging at Grantham.

UPDATE 1500 14/1/2011

- The death toll has risen to 15 following the discovery of a deceased person at Grantham. Due to the state of decomposition the sex of the deceased cannot be determined at this stage.

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- Searches were completed of all houses in Grantham and the cars at the railway bridge late on 13/1/2011.
- The focus today has been on the yards and debris in paddocks adjacent to the railway bridge area.
- It is anticipated that the total search of Grantham township will be completed by the afternoon of 15/1/2011.
- Searches have also continued in Murphy's Creek area.
- The search of the watercourse from Spring Bluff to Grantham is anticipated that this will be completed by the afternoon of 15/1/2011.
- Arrangements have been made for USAR inspectors to commence inspections of houses in Grantham under police supervision, that have been searched in efforts to render them safe and allow recovery and cleanup efforts to commence as soon as possible.
- A police community liaison officer has been appointed to interact with the community and address concerns in the lead up to people returning to their communities.
- Energex advise that it is anticipated that power will be restored to approximately 95% of the affected areas of the Lockyer Valley by the afternoon of 14/1/2011.
- The primary concerns with respect to water in the Lockyer Valley are in Gatton, Grantham, Helidon and Withcott.
- Gatton has insufficient supply and is effectively out of water. Bottled water is being transported to Gatton and distributed to residents on a 'ration' basis.
- QUU have advised at 1400hrs today that it is anticipated that the Lowood Water Treatment Plant which is controlled by SEQ Water will commence operations at approximately 1600hrs today. This plant will then will then commence to pump water to the Lockyer Valley in addition to Lowood and Fernvale areas.
- It is anticipated that water will be restored to Gatton, Lowood, Fernvale, Grantham and Helidon areas by midnight tonight.
- The restoration to other areas of Withcott, Murphy's Creek and Tabletop areas is anticipated to be completed by the afternoon of 15/1/2011. This is dependant upon repair to the Helidon pump station.
- The water supply to Laidley and Forest Hill is low but there is sufficient supply until the water treatment plant comes on line.
- There are currently 16 trucks operating and this is expected to be 26 by the end of today.
- Bottled water continues to be distributed throughout the Lockyer Valley and will remain so until the water treatment plant becomes operational in all areas.
- Water tanks have been established in Withcott which are being filled by water truck. This water is being dispersed to the community in addition to bottled water also being distributed in Withcott and Murphy's Creek.
- An audit is being conducted of residents in the isolated Mt Sylvia area of the Lockyer Valley to determine the number of residents isolated. The LDMG will then assess the prospects of re-supply and/or evacuation due to access to this area possibly being cut for an extended period of up to 6 months due to river crossing having been washed away.
- Cecil Plains remains isolated however Toowoomba LDMG is re-supplying this area through a privately sourced helicopter operator.

UPDATE 0400 15/1/2011

- The diesel water pumps planned for use at the Lowood water treatment plant have not become operational due to connection and mounting failures.
- [REDACTED] of SEQ water [REDACTED] has advised that every efforts is being made to bring these units into service asap. It is expected that they will be in service by 15/1/11 PM.
- Water trucks continue to cart water to supply towers as a contingency.
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- Efforts to locate additional generators through the Department of Communities Recovery Assistance program are continuing.
- Community newsletters and Emergency Alerts requested to advise residents of Gatton to restrict water usage to drinking only and to boil water prior to drinking.
- Request for bulk hand sanitizer made for distribution throughout area to mitigate possible gastroenteritis outbreaks. (Small outbreak reported in Grantham area 14/1/11).
- Briefings to occur 15/1/11 0830 between Field commander and LV LDMG and USAR regarding recovery phase.

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UPDATE 1500hrs 15/1/2011

- Back up diesel pumps at the Lowood Water Treatment Plant have become operational and are supplying water at a rate of 140 litres per second.
- The reservoirs within the Lockyer Valley are now receiving water and will continue to gain volume during the day.
- The backup pump will continue around the clock until the restoration of the main electric pump which is not anticipated to occur until late next week.
- Once the volumes of water in the reservoirs increases there will be sufficient water to supply the affected areas of Gatton, Laidley, Forest Hill, Grantham and Helidon areas.
- Trucks are continuing to cart water and bottled water is being supplied to these affected areas with priority to Withcott and Murphy's Creek areas until all areas have sufficient water supplies.
- Energex has 44 crews working to restore electricity throughout the affected areas. It is expected to be returned progressively over the next two days. Power supply to Murphy's Creek remains the major issue with only 20% of power restored and major infrastructure damage sustained. All Energex crews within the Lockyer Valley will attend Murphy's Creek when finished immediate duties to focus on this area.
- The DDC Toowoomba together with the Assistant Commissioner, Southern Region, Mayor Lockyer Valley [REDACTED] Minister for Police and Commissioner Atkinson attended the Community Recovery Forum held at the Grantham State School to discuss concerns regarding the recovery of the community. A further Community Recovery Forum is being held at Helidon at 1430hours 15/01/2011. All the above mentioned persons are now attending this meeting.
- Search and recovery operations to continue in affected areas. Ground search west of Grantham is continuing.
- Tetanus vaccinations have arrived at the Gatton Hospital and a clinic will operate on 16/01/2011 between 1400 hours and 1700 hours.
- Death toll stands at 15. Total missing persons is at 21. Grave fears are held for 11 of these.

UPDATE 0400hrs 16/01/2011

- Clean up continues in Toowoomba CBD and Oakey.
- Confirmation received of alternative FCP when Grantham completed. Approval given by Director of Property & Facilities at UQ Gatton for FCP at UQ Gatton. Contact is [REDACTED]
- Police divers located vehicle of MP [REDACTED] in Lockyer Creek near Trost Street, Helidon at 1700hrs 15/1/2011. Investigation commenced by Toowoomba CIB.
- PFC at Murphy's Creek terminated.
- Searches continued in the Grantham area including divers searching Lockyer Creek.
- ADF have completed 30% of foot search of flood course towards Brisbane River.
- A/Supt Marcus appointed Liaison Officer to Grantham community and held meeting at Grantham Primary School.

UPDATE 1500hrs 16/01/2011

- The DDC Toowoomba and Assistant Commissioner, Southern Region have attended Community Recovery Forums at Helidon at 1000hours and Grantham at 1330hours to discuss repatriation and associated issues.
- The permanent commissioned officers appointed as Police Liaison for the Helidon and Grantham areas have been introduced to the community and will remain there until repatriation occurs. These officers are Inspector Mike CROWLEY for Helidon and A/Supt Ben MARCUS for Grantham.
- A permanent police presence has been established at the Grantham PCFC prior to repatriation occurring. This presence will remain until it is no longer required.
- Searching has continued in Grantham, with 1 deceased adult female being located.
- Searching by divers is also continuing.
- All evacuees at the Toowoomba Grammar School are expected to leave in the next 24 hours.
- Most residents and businesses in the Lockyer Valley are now receiving water as reservoirs continue to fill. Urban utilities recommend boiling drinking water or using bottled water. Bottled water collection points exist at Gatton, Withcott, Helidon and Laidley.
- Urban utilities are still working on Grantham and Withcott water supply due to reservoir and infrastructure damage, while continuing to transport water to the allocated storage points.

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UPDATE 0400hrs 17/01/2011

- Searching has continued with 1 deceased adult male located in Rocky Creek in a large pile of debris. DVI unit on scene. Searching on this large pile of debris is continuing.
- Searching is continuing in the areas east of Grantham. Members of ADF, SERT and PSRT are assisting with this task.
- Commissioned officers MARCUS and CROWLEY appointed as community liaison, continue to provide information to the communities assigned to them.
- 24 hour police presence utilising the mobile police Facility at Grantham is continuing.
- Electricity blackouts occurred in Grantham area during evening. Energex dispatched crews to address any faults.
- A male juvenile (15yrs) arrested and charged with Looting at Laidley on 11/1/2010.

- Continue to monitor the water situation within the Lockyer Valley with the prospect of water treatment plant commencing operation and all affected areas having restored water supply by the afternoon of 15/1/2011.

- Upon the completion of the search efforts in Grantham the search will continue to move downstream.

- Air resupply of food to Cecil Plains township, which is still isolated, planned for Monday, approximately 11am.
- Toowoomba - Aerial investigation of infrastructure damage (engineering) is currently being planned and resourced.

SITUATION OVERVIEW

1. Weather (Local observations)

On 10/1/11 at approx 1200 a severe rain occurred in Toowoomba and the Lockyer Valley. As a result of this event a number of persons were reported missing in flood waters, vehicles were submerged/washed away and dwellings and premises have received significant/major damage.
