Dear Mr. Rickuss,

We have resided in the Withcott since 1983

We have been keeping rainfall records for the last five years.

For the month of December, 2010, we recorded 543mm of rain. These figures can be verified by neighbours.

The escarpment was saturated and watercourses and creeks were causing flooding and road closures across the Lockyer Valley. (On 6th January, 2011, Withcott experienced a flash flood . Family members who live at the bottom of the Toowoomba Range on the Warrego Highway had their fence knocked over by the force of the water.)

From 1st January, 2011 until 7.00 a.m. on Monday 10th January, 2011 we recorded 288mm of rain. On the same afternoon of 10th January we recorded a further 154mm in 50 minutes, which appears to have been widespread across the escarpment.

As you know ABC Radio was broadcasting warnings of heavy rain and flash flooding for SE Qld on 10th January, 2011.

In addition to this, perhaps authorities need to consider an early warning mobile phone/landline system, which might be of some help in the future.

Also, in our opinion, local authorities need to be kept up to date, if they aren't already, with rainfall figures from across the escarpment. and catchment areas, so as to be aware of the volume of water rushing towards towns and outlying areas. In the future perhaps the Toowoomba Range should be closed earlier than it was as our daughter travelled down the range on Monday afternoon, 10th January during the rain and was fortunate to arrive home safely.

We have collated photographs and also newspaper clippings of flood events prior to 10th January, 2011.

Sadly, we wonder if any amount of warning could have prepared any of us for such an horrific and extraordinary event caused by such a massive amount of water.
