- I, **Lisa Margaret Desmond**, of 77 Tavistock Street, Torquay in the State of Queensland, Chief Executive Officer, Fraser Coast Regional Council, do solemnly and sincerely declare that:-
 - 1. I have been provided with a copy of the letter dated 10 August 2011 from the Commissioner, Queensland Floods Commission of Inquiry requiring a sworn statement and documents from me which is attachment **LMD-1** and which details the topics my statement should cover.

Role

- 2. My qualifications include a Bachelor of Business, Masters of Commerce, Certified Practising Accountant and Member of the Australian Institute of Company Directors. I hold the position of Chief Executive Officer of the Fraser Coast Regional Council ("Council"). I have been employed by Council and its statutory predecessor the Hervey Bay City Council since October 2006. I have worked in local government for approximately 15 years.
- The Fraser Coast region covers an area of 7,125 km from the Gunalda Range to the south, past Howard on the Bruce Highway to the north, east to World Heritage listed Fraser Island and west to Brooweena.

- 5. To the best of my knowledge Council has not instigated any designations of this nature since 2003.
- Item 3: Any planning application to the Minister for Local Government and Planning pursuant to which a planning scheme administered by the Council to the Minister to seek a finding as to whether it appropriately reflects State Planning Policy 1/03.
- 6. This question is answered on the basis that Council would seek such a finding in relation to a planning scheme and not a planning application.

- 7. Three of the planning schemes currently administered by Council have undergone two rounds of State interest checks. The extent to which these relevant planning schemes reflect the State Planning Policy 1/03 is also noted below:
 - (a) Planning Scheme for Tiaro Shire Council first took effect on 21 October 2005 and reflects SPP 1/03 for Bushfire and Landslide Only;
 - (b) Planning Scheme for the Shire of Woocoo first took effect on 27 November 2006 and reflects SPP 1/03 for landslide and bushfire only; it does not include flood); and
 - (c) Hervey Bay City Planning Scheme first took effect on 15 December 2006 and reflects SPP 1/03 for landslide and bushfire only; it does not include flood and was conditioned upon the continued operation and effect of "Flood assessment provisions State Planning Policy 1/03 – Mitigating the Adverse Impacts of Flood, Bushfire and Landslide".

Item 4: The property and development application files considered by Council since 2004, including correspondence, reports for Council and Council meeting minutes, for the following infrastructure:

- (a) Pumping stations, including water and sewer pumping stations;
- (b) Wastewater treatment plants;
- (c) Mobile phones and associated infrastructure;
- (d) Electricity; and
- (e) Emergency services infrastructure.
- 8. A copy of the planning and development application files considered by Council since 2004, for the categories listed at Item 4 (a) (e) are provided in electronic format and have been numbered to correlate with the categories requested.

- 3. Any application to the Minister for Local Government and Planning pursuant to which a planning scheme administered by the Council to the Minister to seek a finding as to whether it appropriately reflects State Planning Policy 1/03.
- 4. The property and development application files considered by Council since 2004, including correspondence, reports for Council and Council meeting minutes, for the following infrastructure:
 - a. pumping stations, including water and sewer pumping stations;
 - b. wastewater treatment plants;
 - c. mobile phone towers and associated infrastructure;
 - d. electricity; and
 - e. emergency services infrastructure.
