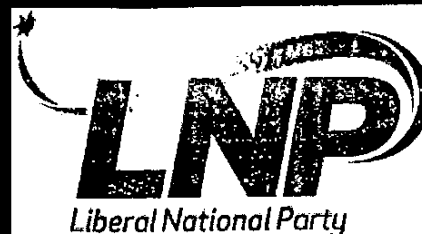

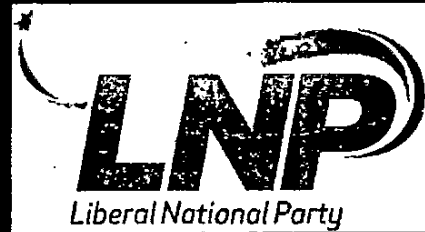


- Other Questions or Statements.
