Requested clarification of what level the flood water will come over the levee banks.

Precautionary measures - need to work action plan in a staged process - need to identify residences as a staged process- when water reaches a certain level, sandbag or evacuate

Confirm agree that it is appropriate to keep people in town where possible; therefore set up adequate evacuation centre facilities.

Further Action Required:-

- Identify properties at potential threat
- Distribute message to landholders with properties at potential risk of encroachment in case of levee bank breach
- Suggest utilize fire trucks for sirens to notify residents to evacuate, if required.

Further Action Required:-

- Information Request - suggest obtain flow figures from BOM (*Dave Burges*)
- Provision of Information to External Agency – forward copy 1996 flood model forwarded to Police Commission for reference (*Dave Burges*)
- Levee Banks - suggest seek advice on saturation of levee bank and duration of event (*Dave Burges*)
- Levee Banks - ramp up surveillance for levee bank tonight (13/01/11) – suggest 4 or 5 teams – brief teams on what to look for (ie saturation levels, leaks, etc), and who to contact (*Dave Burges*)
- Evacuation Planning – (Kaloma / Hospital) do we move the high risk patients in high risk areas at this point in time? How long would it take to evacuation if necessary? Suggest meeting with staff from Kaloma / Hospital / Ambulance to discuss further. (*Councillor Kearney*)
- Welfare Committee – Suggest commence pre-check of potential evacuation centre sites for potential levee bank breach; preliminary check of occupancy rates in local hotels / motels and their availability; planning for where to set up centre dependant on where the breach may potentially be; source potential availability of essential resources such as food, water, bedding, etc (*Peter Stewart & Carl Manton*)

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
