I, Kenneth John Murphy, Senior Beef Extension Officer and Central Queensland Climate Risk Co-ordinator, Department of Employment, Economic Development and Innovation (Rockhampton) state:

- 1. I am employed as the Senior Beef Extension Officer and Central Queensland Climate Risk Co-ordinator at the Department of Employment, Economic Development and Innovation. I am based in Rockhampton. I have been in this role for 29 years.
- 2. After completing a Bachelor's degree at University of Queensland, Gatton College, I worked for CSIRO in Western Australia. I then worked for King Ranch Australia (Elgin Downs) near Clermont, Queensland as stud manager. I later managed a family property near Rockhampton before joining the Department of Primary Industries at Richmond, North Queensland before transferring to Rockhampton in 1987.
- 3. As part of my job, I work in a team of people responsible for the management of climate risk management across the state.
- 4. In that role my duties involve assisting grazing businesses to manage climate risk. This can include extension of husbandry practices to minimise the negative impacts of climate (droughts and floods). It also involves the administration of government assistance measures to maintain a healthy rural industry.
- 5. In the case of the 2010-11 floods, the impact on the beef industry was not as great as past recent floods, as prior to the event most areas were drought free with plenty of fodder available and stock in good condition. Many producers had time to move stock to higher ground, and as a result stock losses were minimal. That said, the unusual scale of this event still managed to catch out some producers. Consequently it was determined that DEEDI would coordinate the availability of fodder, in cooperation with Agforce.
- 6. Generally before each wet season, time is spent dealing with the end of dry season supplementation. In terms of preparations and procedures undertaken in my area prior to the wet season, before leaving for the Christmas vacation, I was asked by Paul Walmsley, Regional Director, to be prepared to be called in should we have any flooding disasters during the holidays. I also had discussions with Greg Robbins, Executive Director, Agriculture Industries and Sustainability, about the possibility of flooding and the fact that there would not be animals in poor condition this year, as the season had been so good and stock were in prime condition. I was already on call New Years Eve as part of my Climate Risk Co-ordinator role.
- 7. During the Christmas-New Year period, Rockhampton and other regions experienced significant flooding. On January 1, 2011, I was asked by Paul Walmsley to take on a co-ordination role for fodder drops across Central Queensland in conjunction with Danielle Hogarth from Agforce. I was aw

- that Senior DEEDI staff were working with industry peak bodies before and after Christmas and with Agforce and across government after Christmas specifically with flood response and recovery grants from 29 December 2011.
- 8. During flood events, cattle often become trapped on small areas of high land surrounded by water. Generally these islands have little fodder so it becomes necessary to get hay to them as they become cold very quickly without full stomachs. The most effective way to get bales of hay to them is by helicopters. Helicopters can pick up hay from nearby and quickly transfer and drop the fodder where stock can access it.
- 9. My role was to receive requests for fodder drops, receive offers of fodder, and develop lists of helicopters available and local contact networks. As the worst affected area was around Moura, I asked Brett Coombe, a property manager from Moura, if he was prepared to co-ordinate on the ground in that area. He agreed. As far as my preparation for this role, I was able to network with my contacts that I had developed in over 40 years of experience working in the region.
- 10. After 24 hours of working on the fodder drops, I agreed to receive all the calls as Danielle Hogarth, Agforce, and myself were preparing identical lists. This prevented duplication and saved time. My role was made more complex because many of my usual contacts were on holiday, or were replaced by others unfamiliar with the position.
- 11. I conducted media interviews immediately with ABC Radio (Jane Patterson and Stacey Miller) and Francis from 2UE. The radio stations were aware of the problems of farmers with stranded livestock, and invited me to do the radio interviews. In these interviews I supplied contact numbers to ring for assistance and offers of fodder. Agforce sent out messages through their network advising people who needed assistance, to contact my number. Other media outlets across the whole of Australia also contacted me and interviews were conducted.
- 12. As January 1, 2011 was a public holiday, I commenced my role using my mobile phone, private home phone and private email and with assistance from my wife I continued this operation throughout each day from 6:00am to 10:00pm until 10 January 2011. This arrangement allowed for more flexible hours and ease of operation. After this date I was able to greatly reduce time spent taking messages and managed the calls through message bank but it was still necessary to keep a close watch on calls for assistance. Calls did however reduce once the worst of the flooding passed.
- 13. During this time I developed a network of other contacts. This included transport companies, RSPCA, Agforce, DEEDI staff, Minister's staff, media contacts and shire councils. I also had contact with an organisation called "Aussie Helpers". Most days I was in contact with Agforce representatives as well as my DEEDI managers.

- 14. As the floods worsened in other parts of the state, I was asked by Greg Robbins, Executive Director, Agriculture Industries and Sustainability, DEEDI, to co-ordinate Fodder Drops across the whole state. I do not have the exact date of this request marked as I was so involved with the on-ground work that recording these dates was not important. I assumed this role and continued my duties as a conduit between those with fodder and those in need.
- 15. EMQ and District Disaster Co-ordinators were aware of my role and passed enquiries for assistance and information of fodder available directly to me. Daily internal DEEDI telelinks provided information to Disaster Management Committee through our DEEDI representative. My notes from the telelinks and calls are contained in my diary, marked "KM-01", as are the dates of the telelinks. Further notes and follow-up actions appear in my email correspondence. My sent items from the period are attached and marked "KM-02", whilst my received items from the period are attached and marked "KM-03".
- 16. During this time when I coordinated fodder drops, I had cause to transfer vital contact and job information to an Excel spreadsheet. A copy of that spreadsheet is attached and marked "KM-04". It details much of the organisation and operation of fodder drops in Central Queensland, and lists the relevant contacts. It is divided into four tabs 'Hay Supply', 'Stock Requests', 'Helicopters' and 'Contact Lists'.
- 17. I stress that my role was a co-ordination role only. There were no promises of free fodder or free helicopter drops. I created a register of fodder, helicopter operators and useful contacts for worst affected areas: Dawson/Mackenzie Fitzroy, and later Balonne/Condamine river systems. People seeking assistance were assured that they could well become eligible for Category 'C' Grants to cover costs of completing fodder drops. Category C grants are grants accessible to primary producers under the Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements ("NDRRA"). Business relief and recovery assistance may be provided following certain natural disaster events under Category B, C or D of the NDRRA.
- 18. Often following disaster events that have impacted on the rural sector, Category B activation under the NDRRA can provide primary producers access to freight subsidies of up to \$5000 for the movement of fodder for emergency relief purposes. However, as stated in the NDRRA Guidelines (at page 37): "Costs involved in the purchase and dropping of fodder to stock isolated by a disaster event (fodder dropping operations) are not eligible for Australian Government/State NDRRA funding. Should a large scale need exist following a severe disaster event, the Queensland Government would consider an appropriate package of arrangements on a case-by-case basis."
- 19. In unusually widespread and severe events, such as the southern Queensland floods in 2010, special assistance may be made available by the provision of recovery grants of up to \$25,000 under Category C of the NDRRA. Eligible expenditure for the Recovery Grants includes fodder drop operations undertaken by the producer. The Government may also provide a

coordination service for producers seeking fodder and or fodder drops, with costs met by the producer using their own resources or accessing Recovery Grants.

- 20. Upon requests for fodder, I gave enquirers the names and contacts of nearby offers of fodder, and contacts for helicopter operators in the area. Interstate fodder offers were advised of the need for documentation. It was also necessary to prevent groups and individuals from sending truckloads of fodder without a destination. They were advised that they needed a recipient coordinator to distribute the fodder on arrival.
- 21. The main animals of interest were predominately cattle and horses, with some requests for pigs and dogs. I did not take on any role in dog issues. The piggeries that were affected were given similar assistance as other livestock enterprises. Some took on the use of a helicopter when they became aware they could be eligible for a Category C grant. Similarly dairy farmers were given suitable fodder sources and acted when I made them aware of their Category C status.
- 22. On January 19, 2011, I forwarded the Fodder Register to the DEEDI Business Information Centre. This is first tab of the Excel spreadsheet marked "KM-04".
- 23. In terms of how the system of providing fodder to flood affected areas could be improved, I note that it is preferable to have one person across the whole system. I feel that overall, the system worked well. People making calls for a free helicopter and fodder delivery were informed of the use of Category 'C' grant money. Most were happy to know it was available. Having a producer on the ground in each area prepared to assist was very helpful for the whole community. I cannot speak highly enough of the help from people such as Brett Coombe, as well as the helicopter pilots.
- 24. My role was very operational to co-ordinate fodder drops, and I am aware that other DEEDI staff (Greg Robbins and Paul Walmsley) were involved with higher level planning of the flood response.

NATIONAL BACKGROUND COMMENTS: Week ending 27<sup>th</sup> January 2011. Please note that direct links to reports on each dairy region immediately follow this national summary for grain and hay.

National Summary - Grain:

- Harvest is still continuing in southern parts of the country with mainly feed grades coming off.
  The majority of the wheat will have sprouted and the barely cleaved with the excessive moisture
  that has fallen in December and November. It is anticipated that the state's winter crop harvest
  will now not be completed until the middle of February, as rain during late December and early
  January caused more delays with access to already wet and inaccessible paddocks.
- The Bureau of Meteorology has released rainfall data with QLD recording its wettest year on record. NSW and SA third wettest year on record, VIC fifth wettest year on record. While in WA has had its direct year on record.
- The summer sorghum harvest has kicked off in the Moree district with quality reports are good and yield indications look very good and are likely to be above previous years for the regions. Due to the favourable growing season. The usual higher yielding eastern area, where flooding will reduce area and yield potential will still produce good levels to restock empty sorghum bids.
- Grain yields of most crops across the east coast have been above long term average yields, with some growers recording the highest yields ever. Grain quality has been the biggest issue across all crops, with significant downgrading occurring as the harvest draws to a close.
- The final extent of the downgrading of quality of this year's winter crop will not be known for several months as growers now begin to deliver grain stored on farm into the bulk handling system or directly to end users. A significant amount of grain has been stored on farm as farm access by trucks was hampered by the wet conditions, a shortage of road transport and the availability of grain silo bagging systems on farms.
- US wheat futures continue to advance on increased demand from Middle East and North African nations, against historical high US stocks. Global stocks are tighter and availability of quality milling grades is also limiting, providing price support. Tight global feed grain stocks are providing price support to feed grade wheat which currently would make up a greater than normal proportion of global stocks. If demand were to ease price corrections lower for current year contracts are likely. Buyers are nervous about the potential for poor weather to hurt coming winter wheat harvests, as well. Key growing areas in China and the western US Plains are struggling without rain.
- Most grades across Qld and NSW are up down \$5 \$12/mt reflecting the increasing glut of feed wheat along the east coast. In Victoria wheat is steady whilst feed barley is up \$10/mt. The increased international demand for grain in SA has pushed prices higher by \$15 \$20/mt. WA prices are up \$10/mt better reflecting their true value, while in Northern Tasmania wheat prices are down \$30 while other grades are steady.
- Dairy Australia has produced a Fact Sheet on the feeding of weather-damaged grain. Check this out on the Dairy Australia website at <a href="https://www.dairyaustralia.com.au">www.dairyaustralia.com.au</a>. Although not suitable for the

milling/malting trade, weather damaged grains offer an excellent feed source for the dairy trade.

### National Summary - Hay:

- Due to its long growing season Lucerne is becoming a shining light in the hay and dairy industry. While first cuts around the country were generally weather damaged subsequent second and third cuts are being produced without damage and good yields.
- However with recent flooding many lucerne stands close to northern Victorian river systems will have their production drastically reduced.
- It is becoming widely acknowledged that there simply is not a large volume of hay around. Two main factors have inhibited production. Firstly the large percentages of paddocks that were cut for hay and then because of persistent wet weather windrows were abandoned and livestock turned onto the paddocks. Secondly the hay that was baled, albeit rain damaged, has now been damaged by excessive rain and floodwaters. The pressure to supply hay of any quality will be challenging in the coming autumn and winter months.
- Victorian hay stocks are being affected by floods. It is conservative to say that for square bales stored outside that are typically stacked six high, that one third of stocks will not be used for livestock consumption. There are many cases of whole stacks falling over due to the sagging of bottom bales, causing the whole stack to be lying in water for many days. This put further pressure on hay supplies for the coming autumn and winter.
- It is still too early to determine what demand will be emanate from Queensland and northern NSW feedlots. Pasture growth after the floods have receded will play a crucial role to the amount of cattle on feed over the coming months.
- With disappointment many dairy farmers are opening up their silage pits and bales to find that the quality is not as expected and protein levels are historically lower. This has encouraged odd sales of lucerne hay to be mixed with on farm silage.
- With this in mind it may be worthwhile feed testing pit and baled silage to avoid any unnecessary surprises. Planning and, if need be, buying now may well pay dividends compared to being exposed to higher prices for high protein hay later on in the autumn when the scramble is on.
- The Queensland floods and their affect on the hay market is still yet to play out. What we do know, is that much of the south east summer forage crop production will be depleted, eg lucerne, millet, sorghum, maize.
- This can be offset by importing Lucerne from South Australia, which has been happening for some months now, and should set to continue with substantial yields from southern lucerne crops.
- Hay production from winter crops and pastures across the majority of the country are in the bale albeit with extreme variance in quality and nutritional value.
- With high yielding crops along the eastern state there may be a false perception that there is plenty of hay around. This is not actually the case. Hay of reasonable nutritional value without weather damage is in limited supply and producers are happy to store hay in shed and see how the autumn and winter hay markets pan out.

- There is a second chance for those with lucerne paddocks to make hay without weather damage from second and third cuts. Given the decrease in water prices and increase in production from dryland stands lucerne could will play a pivotal role in supplying high protein fodder to the dairy market this year. However if quality is good enough the chaff market will be a fierce competitor.
- There is strong demand for lucerne form the horse industry as Northern NSW and South East Queensland have also not been able to produce lucerne without weather damage.
- Partly due to weather damage but also the high yielding crops are producing hay of lower nutritional value. The message here is, buy with a feedtest, so there will be no surprises when milk is in the vat.
- It is important to consider that while it seems there is an abundance of paddock feed and conserved fodder around, the reality is that the majority of hay is weather damaged and will only be suitable for fibre in the winter time.
- At least 50% of the Victorian vetch crop has weather damage along with 1<sup>st</sup> cut lucerne.
- Extensive rain damage to hay crops is common throughout all Eastern Australian States. To the point where windrows are being abandoned and stock turned on to these paddocks.
- Whatever way you look at it high quality hay is in short supply. Typically there is always a need
  for hay in late autumn early winter. There is almost certainly the chance there will be a scramble
  for hay without weather damage and prices will adjust accordingly. Now may be a good time to
  purchase at least a portion of what is envisaged will be needed.
- Nationally the variance in quality and nutritional value of hay will be extreme. Oaten hay yields vary across the country from ½t/ha to 17 t/ha. Metabolisable Energy from these crops range from 11ME to 6ME respectively. The message here is for the Eastern State hay buyer's, don't expect this seasons hay to produce the same volume of milk as hay from previous years of drought stressed crops where sugar and energy levels were much higher. Insist on a feed analysis from your hay supplier.
- In contrast those in Western Australia may be able to feed less, given the high quality of cereal hay this year. Your nutritionist will be a valuable resource here.
- An uninspiring hay market at the moment. Producers are experiencing challenging curing conditions in eastern Australia. Rain has been consistently each weekend for the past six weeks extensively damaging hay in windrows.
- There are many crops in Northern Victoria that were cut which simply won't be baled the damage is that bad.
- If high protein hay is used in your operation and your hay supplier has new seasons of good quality it may be prudent to secure a portion now in order to reduce the risk of not being able to find any in the summer and autumn.
- Canola hay is available in Western Australia and with it some aspects need to be considered when feeding to cows. Nitrate/Nitrite levels in canola hay can be toxic to livestock if too high. Nitrate/nitrite levels can be tested from a core sample in conjunction with a regular fodder test.
- \* Canola hay can be valuable as part of a ration, and advice from a nutritionist experienced in

feeding canola hay should be sought before making purchasing decisions.

• Potentially high levels of nitrate are summarised in the following table with two test methods.

- Rain is the prime dictator of hay quantity but this year rain or lack of it, is dramatically dictating quality. The dry season in Western Australia has led to cereal crops of exceptional quality.
- Like never before will feedtest results be so important. Given exceptional seasonal conditions in the Eastern States, cereal crop yields per hectare will be high. It is anticipated that as a result of high yielding crops, energy and protein levels will be lower than in previous years where crops have been drought stressed and sugar levels higher.

From the fodder drop point of view things went OK. I believe there was a little confusion when assistance needed for animals of unknown ownership although the two cases worked out OK. An SES helicopter was deployed and able to do the job well.

This report has been commissioned by Dairy Australia to provide an independent and timely assessment of grain and hay markets in each dairying region. It should be remembered that actual prices may vary for quality or other reasons. All prices are quoted are exclusive of GST.

NATIONAL BACKGROUND COMMENTS: Week ending 20<sup>th</sup> January 2011. Note: full report, with summaries for each dairying region available at <a href="http://www.dairyaustralia.com.au/Farm/Feeding-cows/Bought-in-feeds/Grain-and-Hay-Report.aspx">http://www.dairyaustralia.com.au/Farm/Feeding-cows/Bought-in-feeds/Grain-and-Hay-Report.aspx</a> later today or tomorrow

#### National Summary - Grain:

- Majority of mainland grain growers will be in their final paddock, apart from growers in Southern
  Victoria harvest will drag into early to mid February at best. With last week's deluge of rain, most grain
  on the stalk will probably be downgraded into feed categories.
- Trade activity in central and southern QLD has grounded to a halt, with the heavy rain and flooding restricting access to upcountry sites. Rail shipments and FOB shipments will further be delayed. However it is worth noting that QLD on average only produces 5% of the total Australian wheat crop.
- Increased flooding along the Wimmera, Avoca, Loddon, Campaspe and Yarriambiack has inundated many areas in Victoria restricting grain access further. Not even the Murray Goulburn plant in Rochester could escape the floods, with milk being diverted into the nearby plant of Cobram.
- Last week on January 13th, the USDA (US department of Agriculture) released their monthly world stocks and cropping estimates reports. It was a big one! Although it reported there are ample stocks of wheat in the world, it was very bullish for corn and soybeans. As corn and beans are the biggest agricultural crops in the world, so if these prices rally, wheat will follow.
- Remaining 2010-11 corn and soybean stocks must be rationed and both markets must fight for planted
  acres in the northern Hemisphere sowing window in May/June 2011 (especially corn with US stockpiles
  at 15 years low and amazingly down 25.4mmt compared to last year!) This suggests prices are headed
  higher and will set the tone for international markets for the first half of 2011.
- For more in depth analyse of the report check out this week's Profarmer newsletter, however one
  factor that still could push prices higher is a stronger La Nina on South American and US growing season
  conditions. If dry conditions spread north to Brazil and into US (as is the pattern of a major La Nina
  event), current production and stock estimates will be severely challenged and panic buying will again
  arise.
- So what does US corn price mean for my weather damaged downgraded Aussie wheat? The trade is
  reporting overseas Australian feed wheat demand is picking up from Asian buyers, competing against US
  corn that traditionally is sourced for their stock feed rations. So if traditional US corn importing countries
  start rationing their demand due to increased prices, and make the switch to the surplus Australian feed
  wheat, there will be some gradual recovery in feed wheat prices once local harvest pressure eases.
- Most grades across Qld and NSW are up from \$5 \$12/mt reflecting the stronger international prices and restricted logistical issues that are arising because of the floods and general wet weather. In Victoria wheat is up \$7/mt whilst feed barley is down \$5/mt reflecting the bigger barley crop and preference for wheat. With the increased international demand for grain in SA has pushed prices higher by \$15 \$20/mt. WA prices are down \$15/mt better reflecting their true value, while in Northern Tasmania prices are steady.
- Dairy Australia has produced a Fact Sheet on the feeding of weather-damaged grain. Check this out on the Dairy Australia website at <u>www.dairyaustralia.com.au</u>. Although not suitable for the milling/malting trade, weather damaged grains offer an excellent feed source for the dairy trade.

#### National Summary - Hay:

- Victorian hay stocks are being affected by floods. It is conservative to say that for square bales stored outside that are typically stacked six high, that one third of stocks will not be used for livestock consumption. There are many cases of whole stacks falling over due to the sagging of bottom bales, causing the whole stack to be lying in water for many days. This put further pressure on hay supplies for the coming autumn and winter.
- It is still too early to determine what demand will be emanate from Queensland and northern NSW feedlots. Pasture growth after the floods have receded will play a crucial role to the amount

of cattle on feed over the coming months.

- With disappointment many dairy farmers are opening up their silage pits and bales to find that
  the quality is not as expected and protein levels are historically lower. This has encouraged odd
  sales of lucerne hay to be mixed with on farm silage.
- With this in mind it may be worthwhile feed testing pit and baled silage to avoid any unnecessary surprises. Planning and, if need be, buying now may well pay dividends compared to being exposed to higher prices for high protein hay later on in the autumn when the scramble is on.
- The Queensland floods and their affect on the hay market is still yet to play out. What we do know, is that much of the south east summer forage crop production will be depleted, eg lucerne, millet, sorghum, maize.
- This can be offset by importing Lucerne from South Australia, which has been happening for some months now, and should set to continue with substantial yields from southern lucerne crops.
- Hay production from winter crops and pastures across the majority of the country are in the bale albeit with extreme variance in quality and nutritional value.
- With high yielding crops along the eastern state there may be a false perception that there is plenty of hay around. This is not actually the case. Hay of reasonable nutritional value without weather damage is in limited supply and producers are happy to store hay in shed and see how the autumn and winter hay markets pan out.
- There is a second chance for those with lucerne paddocks to make hay without weather damage from second and third cuts. Given the decrease in water prices and increase in production from dryland stands lucerne could will play a pivotal role in supplying high protein fodder to the dairy market this year. However if quality is good enough the chaff market will be a fierce competitor.
- There is strong demand for lucerne form the horse industry as Northern NSW and South East Queensland have also not been able to produce lucerne without weather damage.
- Partly due to weather damage but also the high yielding crops are producing hay of lower nutritional value. The message here is, buy with a feedtest, so there will be no surprises when milk is in the vat.
- It is important to consider that while it seems there is an abundance of paddock feed and conserved fodder around, the reality is that the majority of hay is weather damaged and will only be suitable for fibre in the winter time.
- At least 50% of the Victorian vetch crop has weather damage along with 1<sup>st</sup> cut lucerne.
- Extensive rain damage to hay crops is common throughout all Eastern Australian States. To the point where windrows are being abandoned and stock turned on to these paddocks.
- Whatever way you look at it high quality hay is in short supply. Typically there is always a need for hay in late autumn early winter. There is almost certainly the chance there will be a scramble for hay without weather damage and prices will adjust accordingly. Now may be a good time to purchase at least a portion of what is envisaged will be needed.

- Nationally the variance in quality and nutritional value of hay will be extreme. Oaten hay yields vary across the country from ½t/ha to 17 t/ha. Metabolisable Energy from these crops range from 11ME to 6ME respectively. The message here is for the Eastern State hay buyer's, don't expect this seasons hay to produce the same volume of milk as hay from previous years of drought stressed crops where sugar and energy levels were much higher. Insist on a feed analysis from your hay supplier.
- In contrast those in Western Australia may be able to feed less, given the high quality of cereal hay this year. Your nutritionist will be a valuable resource here.
- An uninspiring hay market at the moment. Producers are experiencing challenging curing conditions in eastern Australia. Rain has been consistently each weekend for the past six weeks extensively damaging hay in windrows.
- There are many crops in Northern Victoria that were cut which simply won't be baled the damage is that bad.
- If high protein hay is used in your operation and your hay supplier has new seasons of good quality it may be prudent to secure a portion now in order to reduce the risk of not being able to find any in the summer and autumn.
- Canola hay is available in Western Australia and with it some aspects need to be considered
  when feeding to cows. Nitrate/Nitrite levels in canola hay can be toxic to livestock if too high.
  Nitrate/nitrite levels can be tested from a core sample in conjunction with a regular fodder test.
- Canola hay can be valuable as part of a ration, and advice from a nutritionist experienced in feeding canola hay should be sought before making purchasing decisions.
- Potentially high levels of nitrate are summarised in the following table with two test methods.

- Rain is the prime dictator of hay quantity but this year rain or lack of it, is dramatically dictating quality. The dry season in Western Australia has led to cereal crops of exceptional quality.
- Like never before will feedtest results be so important. Given exceptional seasonal conditions in the Eastern States, cereal crop yields per hectare will be high. It is anticipated that as a result of high yielding crops, energy and protein levels will be lower than in previous years where crops have been drought stressed and sugar levels higher.

there are three Biosecurity requirements for hay entering Queensland.

- 1/ Each source property that donates hay will need to fill out a IPA Weed Hygiene-Declaration. (attached). The declaration forms will need to travel with the consignment and be handed to the receivers of the hay in Qld.
- 2/ The transporter will also need to complete part 2 of one of the declaration forms that applies to each truck load of hay.
- 3/ You will need to contact the NSW Dept Agriculture directly and obtain an Inspectors Approval for each consignment of hay. The Inspectors Approval will describe how the consignment meets Qld Plant Entry Condition 10 (copy attached)

Mrs Thomas (owner's mother) rang me on Thursday complaining that her son was being given no assistance with the floods. I gave her several contact phone numbers of people who had offered fodder. I also gave her several phone numbers for helicopter companies working in southern Queensland. I said her son was eligible for assistance from flood relief and could use that asistance to pay for fodder drops. I also suggested that she should try to get the hay as close as possible to the complex so the helicopter would not be too expensive. I also asked her to contact me again if she was unable to get hay from the contacts that I provided but heard nothing more from her. She seemed happy then next day I became aware that she had made approaches through other channels and again on Sunday to Fiona Thompson.

Update on this one.

Have finally been able to talk to someone (Hayley) at the property owned by Paul Thomas at Waverley Rd, Lake Manchester (near Kholo/lpswich). They have 35 horses (mostly Thoroughbreds, 2 Welshies) - 3 foals (approx 2-3 mths), 7 yearlings. Have been cut off by flood waters since 19/12/2010.

Below is what was passed on to me by Hayley:

"Have been able to get to get car across flooded cause way twice since 19/12/2010 when water dropped to approx 0.8m (water was up to bonnet). Paul picked up some human and horse supplies in those 2 occasions.

Have had no power until last few days. Have patchy mobile reception at best of times. Were unable to charge phones as no power. Did get one day when had mobile reception and sent text to Paul's mother to say desperately needed feed and vet Tx for horses.

The house has not been flood affected but 2 bridges and some fences on the pty were taken down.

Paul swam across the flooded road approx 5 times to get human food from Mt Crosby evac centre but obviously can't swim back with horse food."

Horse industry organised equine therapist and 30 bales hay and some vet supplies to be helicopter dropped to

#### property today.

The equine therapist has assessed most horses as being condition score 2 with several horses having cuts and abrasions. A mare and foal are cut off from the mob and isolated across a river/creek. Paul has been swimming/canoeing across to feed them. One horse has died not sure if drowned or broken neck from tree falling on it

Ken Murphy (DEED! Agri-Science) has talked to Paul's mother (Mrs. Thomas) and he talked through multiple options available to them, none of which Mrs. Thomas wanted to take up. Apparently Mrs. Thomas became irate when talking to Ken. Both Ken and myself are a little dubious as to whether this is a legitimate request. Sorry if I have misrepresented you here Ken - please feel free to correct me. Ken elevated this situation to Rob Setter after his dealings with Mrs. Thomas as he was concerned.

Paul and Hayley are claiming they have made requests to SES, RSPCA and DEEDI and no one has responded. To make things worse Hayley's husband committed suicide before Christmas and she was unable to attend the funeral on the 21/12/2010 as she was flooded in at Lake Manchester.

I feel the horse industry will be able to handle this potential horse welfare situation with some facilitation from me. The exact details are still sketchy and I will talk to an equine vet tomorrow that I know who is in that general area and apparently has a better take on the situation. Will keep you updated as I learn more.

- 3/ You will need to contact the NSW Dept Agriculture directly and obtain an Inspectors Approval for each consignment of hay The Inspectors Approval

will describe how the consignment meets Qld Plant Entry Condition 10 (copy attached)

As you know we have been developing a fodder register and using the register to put people requiring hay in touch with those offering hay or fodder. We took this path as flood affected producers were eligible for up to \$25.000 grant to restore their business.

If we spend time and effort bringing fodder to a site there is often the people most deserving missing out or hay left in these sites after the demand has gone. I have been told by Victorian producers that this happened after the Victorian bushfires. I have spoken to some representatives from Victorian service clubs and suggested that if they wish to send fodder up to make contact with a local flood affected service club and ensure that they have a demand for fodder then send it directly to that club. I suggested clubs such as Dalby, Surat, Chinchilla or Goondiwindi in particular.

We have had requests from dairies over the last two days and once we became a ware of their plight we immediately put them in touch with fodder offers and helicopter companies. Unfortunately the dairy farmers did not put out any requests until their stock were dying. It wouldn't matter how much hay we had it would be no use if we don't know who needs it.

I shall ring the Victorian Rotary contact and discuss this with him.

Hi Jessie.

Calvin Muller, a Warracknabeal farmer and fellow committee member, has suggested we look at coordinating the donation of hay to affected farmers in Queensland. We have discussed a few ideas and believe it is feasible to institute a program over the next couple of weeks that would manage donations, transport and funding.

#### Very briefly:

- · there is significant hay available around the place,
- transport capacity will become available as the Victorian harvest concludes over the next few weeks.
- a website could easily be quickly developed to assist coordination of donations, transport, funds for fuel, accommodation for drivers, recipient requirements,
- Rotarian farmers with harvest completed would likely be able to assist with transport, administration and coordination,
- Rotary clubs between here and Queensland could be mobilised to donate fuel, meals and billets,
- With trucks on the road there may be opportunities to assist with other logistical needs,
- Hay is not likely to be needed for some days or even weeks (too wet to get in) so we have an opportunity to make sound preparations.

Calvin and I are both prepared to give this a red hot go and I'm sure many of our committee would also pitch in (I haven't contacted them yet). I believe we could fund a solid beginning from our committee's current resources without threatening other programs. I don't foresee a large cash requirement to get rolling.

If you are happy for our committee to proceed we can prepare a more detailed plan.

Look forward to your reply.



From an Invasive Plant perspective, have you considered the potential threat of hay being transported from outside of local areas for fodder drops?

There is the risk of weed seeds being transported into clean areas. Some high risk weed areas including the Central Highlands (Parthenium) and Giant rats tail grass from the coast. Also there are weed species in NSW and Vic that we do not have in Qld and do not particularly want them

Land holders need to be aware of this issue when purchasing hay for fodder drops. Also, as there is a large amount of grass in most areas there may not be a great demand for extra fodder

Hi All.

Some critical issues are starting to arise for pig producers given the continued (and expected further) rain and flooding, especially in the areas of getting good feed supplies in and pigs out.

Atached is an initial brief report prepared by Sara Willis highlighting the issues with some examples from the 20 producers she has rung so far in the likely worst affected areas. Sara will ring further producers and liase closely with Qld Pork Limited and importantly will take on a State-wide Extension liasion role for the pig industry areas with the support of Gary Collman (who will return from leave next week to assist). This will provide a specific pig issue liasion role across the state and enable extra information flow to ERDs and regional teams. Sara and Gary wil also be providing specific technical, production and business support to affected piggeries and advise of piggeries needing urgent asistance that they become aware of.

Important issues identified especially in the Rocky, Burnett and Downs areas occurring now:

#### Feed Supplies:

Critically now in the Yamba area NW of Rocky, there is at least 1 piggery on the Fitzroy River that will run out of feed by Wed 12 Jan and will have to find means of the feed in if flood waters remain high. This piggery is reliant on mixed rations and doesn't have feed facilities. This piggery is in close liason with its feed supplier in Biloela; but may be in need of assistance from CQ Disaster Relief.

Paul & Peter - I will forward above producers details separately for you.

Piggeries reliant on bringing in mixed rations generally stock up with about 2 weeks feed supply at a time. Others have ration mixing facilities and can at least work off locally sourced grain.

#### Pigs Out to market:

Being able to get pigs out to market is critical issue, not only because of the small window of opportunity to meet highest prices on the grid, <u>BUT</u> critically because a piggery is a continuously operating input-throughput system that means piggeries become rapidly overstocked and rapidly increased feed consumption and as well as disease and welfare issues commencing and rapidly escalating.

Further details are in the attached document. We will continue to keep you informed.

The LNP has called for these drops - Ray Hopper claims he has been contacted by four producers phoning asking for the drops. Dalby Mayor Ray Brown has also said the drops need to begin immediately.

At what stage is the planning of the drops? Who will conduct them? Who will operate the drops? (army, private operators? etc..)

Proposed Response from Tim Mulherin:

Fodder drops have been conducted across Central and Southern Queensland since Friday 31st December.

Fodder drops are coordinated by the Department of Economic Development and Innovation (DEEDI) in conjunction with Agforce. I'd encourage anyone who is in need of fodder to contact hem Mulphy at PLEDI on 0419658412 so he can arrange for fooder to be delivered. I understand there are a couple of beliefter companies in the balby and Chinchalla area looking to conduct fodder drops. We have also received numerous offers of fodder supply.

Mr Hopper's comments about the Government denying fodder drops are incorrect and unhelpful in an emergency response situation.

I have been in constant contact with Opposition Members in flood affected areas, including Mr Hopper about the Category C assistance activation and it being used for fodder drops.

Queensland is facing unprecedented levels of flooding and Mr Hopper is using the disaster as an opportunity for political point scoring, it's disgraceful.

On Monday, Prime Minister Julia Gillard and Premier Anna Bligh announced that small businesses and primary producers in 13 Local Government Areas were eligible to receive grants of up to \$25,000 for clean up and recovery under Category C assistance

I'd like to remind primary producers that fodder drops for stranded livestock are an eligible activity for Catagory C grants, and would encourage those in need of fodder to apply for the grants.

We're not sure if you can point us in the right direction...we have 300 head of cattle stranded on a very small island downstream from Theodore. We phoned emergency services to arrange a fodder drop, and were told the government has not yet given approval for them. We're wondering if you can let us know who we need to get onto to lobby for this to happen - and quickly! We have paid for a helicopter ourselves and fed them this morning, but it's sticking in our necks a bit that they don't consider this a priority. Thousands of cattle have been washed away - a single mob of 1100 head from just one property that we know of. Many of them will wash up on sandbars and odd places along the river - and will need to be fed.

Thanks in anticipation of any information you may be able to give us.

In the SCRC teleconference on 2nd January the DEEDI representative said that as of that day they had activated a call centre for Primary Producers — 132523 - so I have replied to the below email with that number and advising that I was also forwarding their email to DEEDI. The DEEDI rep also said they had a combined Ag Force and DEEDI group working on the delivery of fodder for primary producers - details will be circulated. The communication strategy was to work with Communities to get information into the community recovery newsletter to be distributed through the network.

Enquiry: Approx 80 head of cattle including calves, currently in a neighbours paddock, boggy and they are sinking to their knees, but better than his paddocks, feed will only last about 1 day in the paddock. No fences left in much of the country around the area. Caller needs to move his cattle from where they are in Dalby 30 klms north into the hills - will be on the noth side of the Lodoun bridge over the Condamine River on the Mooney Highway. Dave was waiting on the special permit for a 5ton load limit and it was all set but someone higher up pulled it and said no. The contact in Warwi ck was Shane Heggarty office) who was told to pull the permit. The alternate ph: route given was to drive the cattle through Gundawindi and Toowoomba then back into Dalby to the new location but Dave said that the majority of the cattle are exhausted and wouldn't survive the trip. He said they were healthy and in good nick but is worried about the distance (6 hour trip) compared to 30 minute trip over the bridge. He was hoping to get them over the bridge before the bridge is closed. He had them on a ridge with good feed during the flood but water went over it and became too boggy. The cattle have already been swimming.

I haven't been able to get onto Shane Heggarty on those numbers - but this morning spoke with Dave and he was in the process of moving his cattle via another route. He sounded very decent but was a bit upset that red tape could get in the way in times like this. He will be phoning me later to give me more details and I will send anything onto you. Shane Heggarty is from the Warwick transport department. Apparently he told Dave that he couldn't let him through when they were not letting others pass through. Dave tried to explain that his cattle were good and fat but they were tired and had footrot and many wouldn't survive the alternative route. Dave is going to make a complaint to his local member and to the transport department but it might be something DEEDI or us can bring up at SDRG / or SCRC meetings - even if only in debrief.

# Additional support for flood-affected farmers and small businesses

Minister for Primary Industries, Fisheries and Rural Regional Queensland, Tim Mulherin MP has today announced additional natural disaster assistance for primary producers and small businesses in 23 floodaffected Local Government Areas across Queensland.

Category B assistance under the Natural Disaster Rellef and Recovery Arrangements (NDRRA) will enable affected primary producers and small business operators in those regions to apply for low-interest concessional loans and freight subsidies to assist with recovery from the flood event, he said.

This follows approval of Category A emergency relief and assistance for restoration of public assets in 41 Local Government Areas (LGAs).

NDRRA assistance is jointly funded by the Queensland and Australian Governments, and will help to speed up and offset the cost of recovery in flood-affected areas.

The government has been able to gain an accurate measure of the flood impact on producers and small businesses activated NDRRA Category B assistance in the following LGAs:

Balonne, Banana, Barcaldine, Blackall-Tambo, Bundaberg, Central Highlands, Cherbourg, Gladstone, Goondiwindi, Isaac, Lockyer Valley, Longreach, Maranoa, Murweh, North Burnett, Rockhampton, Scenic Rim, Somerset, South Burnett, Southern Downs, Toowoomba, Woorabinda and Western Downs.

The Queensland Government will continue to closely monitor the situation in other LGAs as the flooding in many areas has yet to reach its peak, said the Minister.

Primary producers outside of the above Category B declared areas who have been impacted by flooding and wish to access NDRRA Category B assistance can apply for an Individually Disaster Stricken Property (IDSP) declaration, he said.

NDRRA Category B assistance provides:

- a) concessional loans through QRAA to small business and primary producers of up to \$250,000.
- b) freight subsidies for primary producers of up to \$5,000.

- Other contacts such as EMQ, DoC, QRAA, BeyondBlue etc
- and anything clse required

Some of this info we should have from previous events eg 3 day sickness factsheets.

My guess is the earliest the call centre would have info available to provide would be tomorrow. I don't think we can wait until Tuesday!

I have spoken to Ken and Brent Finlay.

We need to get a process in place between DEEDI, AgForce (Regional) and LDMG's to cater for the calls for fodder drops.

Ken has spoken to Cam Day about expediting Cat C announcement.

Irrespective QRRA has confirmed that payment for fodder drops will be eligible under Cat C. Furthermore as long as it can be tied to this event, those landholders in declared areas will be eligible to claim expenditure if they happen to incur the expense before the announcement.

Ian and Bruce can you get this process in place?

Banana shire seems to be the key area at the moment as people are looking at their options between Dawson runs.

It may be best to start there. Contact AgForce's regional manager Danielle Hogarth

Michael McTaggart is stranded at home but can give an overview of potential demand,

Obviously we need this process across a wider area - Central Highlands for example as next hot spot.

We also need to get AgForce reps on LDMGs. Jim has started this process but we need to finalise. Brent wants to get Regional Presidents involved. We need Brent to confirm names and contacts today.

There is no immediate fodder drops planned but this may change.

First thing is process, then advice on Cat C and eligible costs etc.

There are numerous lines in to the feds to get Cat C happening.

Those in non-declared areas will need to make a judgement about incurring such costs and establish a case for the LGAs to be included. The Premier has requested the ability to extend.

There is a bit of frustration developing in the absence of a process.

As the flood situation continues to develop we may need to add further LG's or part's of LG's to the Category C list. The Commonwealth has agreed to allow further additions upon the recommendation of Minister Roberts - Queensland Minister for Police, Corrective Services and Emergency Services.

Therefore, as DEEDI undertakes impact assessments over the next couple weeks and if they justify further activations, Minister Mulherin will write to Minister Roberts seeking those additions. A good example of this is that South Region (Sarah Buckler) and ASQ (Andrew Ward) are inspecting Toowoomba Regional Council today verifying the growing number of reports from industry and community that the areas around Millmerran, Cecil Plains, Pittworth and Clifton have been heavily impacted. Once this is verified, we will seek to get Toowoomba Regional Council activated.

Prime Minister Julia Gillard and Premier Anna Bligh today announced additional Commonwealth-State disaster assistance to help small businesses and primary producers impacted by Queensland's flood crisis.

The Prime Minister said today's announcement would see small businesses and primary producers in 13 Local Government Areas eligible to receive grants of up to \$25,000 for

clean up and recovery.

We know there are far too many families who have had to leave not only their homes, but also their businesses.

This targeted financial assistance will help them minimise their economic losses as they embark on the very difficult recovery period that lies ahead and help businesses start trading as soon as possible.

The grants will be made available immediately to the 13 Local Government areas of Banana, Barcaldine, Bundaberg, Central Highlands, Cherbourg, Lockyer Valley, North Burnett, Scenic Rim, Somerset, South Burnett, Southern Downs, Western Downs, and Woorabinda.

Category C assistance will help primary producers with cleanup, removal of debris, disposal of dead livestock and further restoration without which production and viability could be disrupted beyond the next season.

This will include costs incurred by primary producers for urgent fodder drops for stranded livestock.

For small business Category C grants will help operators resume trading as soon as possible, including establishment costs in temporary premises.

This assistance may also be extended to other areas once the impact of the floods in each area can be properly assessed.

Category C assistance does not compensate for income losses and is not intended to replace insurance. The grant scheme will run until 30 September 2011.

Concessional interest rate loans of up to \$250,000 for small business operators and primary producers, as well as freight subsidies of up to \$5,000, are available across 23 Local Government Areas.

The Prime Minister said the Gillard Labor Government would continue to work with the Bligh Government to ensure this recovery happens as quickly as possible.

This is a major natural disaster and recovery will take a significant amount of time.

The extent of flooding being experienced by Queensland is unprecedented and requires a national and united response to provide as much support to communities as we can.

Some places, such as Rockhampton, are still battling floodwaters, so our focus there is on emergency disaster relief, but they too will have this assistance ready and available to them once the flood waters subside.

Premier Bligh said it had been a dreadful start to the new decade for tens of thousands of Queenslanders, particularly those on the land.

While the long term impact of the floods crisis will take some time to determine, thousands of Queensland families and businesses are suffering right now.

These grants will go some way to help primary producers with the heartbreaking clean up, as well as the more urgent task of feeding stranded livestock.

The additional grants announced today come on top of the range of assistance already being provided by both the Queensland Government and the Australian Government.

The Australian Government Disaster Recovery Payment (AGRDP) is available for people who have been significantly impacted by the floods.

The AGDRP is a payment of \$1000 for each eligible adult and \$400 for each eligible child, including people who have lost their homes or whose homes have sustained major damage.

Joint State and Commonwealth Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (NDRRA) have been activated for 41 local government areas.

Under the NDRRA, councils will be able to access funding from the Australian and Queensland Governments to assist with the cost of restoring essential public infrastructure as well as the cost of counter disaster operations.

Disaster relief funding arrangements have also been activated for people experiencing personal hardship in a number of local government areas.

These funding arrangements consist of:

- · Emergent Assistance Payment up to \$170 per person and \$780 per family.
- Means tested Essential Household Contents Grant up to \$1,660 for individuals and \$4,980 for couples or families.
- Means tested Repairs to Dwellings / Structural Assistance Grant up to \$10,250 for individuals and \$13,800 for couples or families.

As requested rang several properties along the Issaac (Seloh Nolem, Tay Glen, Watonga) and the Connors (Barmount, Cockenzie)

The most descriptive quotation was 'It has been a moderate flood with the water generally contained within the channels.

The most authoritive quotation was 'Rocky was lucky that the Issac Connors did not also have a big weather event'

Generally most water in the Fitzroy catchment is at and below the junction of the Mackenzie River. North of this point the December rainfall event did not contribute significant impact on agriculture. Any impact has resulted from total rainfall throughout 2010 which in general terms delivered approx twice average rainfall and several periods of extensively cloudy days. Ground preparation has been delayed, weed control has been difficult, growth has been slow and some crops remain unharvested but the optimists are still hopeful even though quality will be reduced. Generally there is a sentiment of 'more good than harm'.

No cattle losses are known and as reported the usual movement of cattle by helicopter to higher ground was conducted in advance of the flood. Sandflies (Dawson River) and buffalo fly are troublesome – Historically they have been difficult to treat and livestock, humans and wildlife, in spite of discomfort, have survived.

No comments were made about the mining sector. Staff are known to be moving back to worksites. Reports from those I know who work in the sector are mostly 'sick of the inactivity' so obviously production is at a standstill.

Significant numbers of rural families travelled to Mackay for household supplies (3-4 weeks since last stocking up). Fresh food supplies were low at many shopping centres by mid day yesterday.

There was large scale mortality of buffel, however the native 3Ps stayed alive. 3 days of inundation seemed to be the level where mortalities would occur, and this was worsened if a layer of silt was deposited on the plant. My gut feeling was the better the land condition the less the mortality of buffel. The guys on the Belyando were out reseeding buffel within days as they had seen it before and knew the seedbank was needed.

A full soil profile on deep clay soils in summer with no competition from the buffel means a critical risk of weed invasion - particularly parthenium and parkinsonia. But the risk is there for all and sundry to establish. The belyando did get a lot of parthenium and it was 12 months before the buffel was well established again. Nogoa got a lot of parkinsonia.

For buffel mortality best management has to be reseed and spell until the buffel is up and competitive.

The other line of thinking is that if we keep getting these floods the native 3Ps may end up dominant and be the most sustainable pasture.

Our Northern Gulf floods in 08-09 was for quite a long time with up to 10 weeks inundation of pastures in the worst affected areas

All the Gulf pastures were native species and most died under the water

As you would expect our monitoring sites showed the areas destocked after the flooding responded with a lot of annual species in the following 09-10 wet and paddocks where cattle were allowed back stayed in poor condition. The light soils seemed to bounce back the best even if it was only annual species.

The heavy more fertile soils did not respond as well in the following 09-10 wet but we suspect these areas were in fairly poor condition when the flood happened

The Gulf flood severely affected aprox 35 properties most with large numbers of cattle but only 5 properties drastically reduced cattle numbers in Autumn 2009 because of a lack of grass

The other 30 properties done nothing even though cattle prices were reasonable and plenty of agistment was available further south on the Downs. They run out of grass and later in 2009 thousands of head of cattle died

As discussed with Ken a short time ago, Elton and Vern are looking at the case to include Isaac Shire (or is it Isaac Regional Council?) or part of the shire for cat c assistance grants. We are keen to ensure any areas where fodder drops have taken place are covered.

The issue is whether it is all or part of the local government area which is declared.

We would greatly appreciate your thoughts on this and, in particular, the basis for any potential declaration of part of the shire. For example, using roads as boundaries, or using catchments or sub-catchments.

Please put your minds to this and let us know what you reckon.

# Morning Everyone

We had spoken about this in the Toowoomba office as well and intend to put together a media release or something similar. We thought a few points to make were:

- Don't panic pastures are generally fairly resilient and will recover.
- Burning probably not a good idea, the plant doesn't need another stress on top of recovering from flooding.
- Spelling to allow the plants to recover and grow new leaves; and allow seedlings to come through. This is
  probably the most critical component of pasture recovery from flooding.
- Length of time under the flood short inundations there will be some tussocks and seed bank survive which will
  allow the pasture to recover over time. Long periods of inundation (maybe >week if deep and silt, definitely >2
  weeks for buffel) will have significant deaths and there maybe reason to reseed especially if wanting to establish a
  more flood tolerant pasture.
- Reseeding Need to consider whether the cost is warranted (depending on situation). On the lower Fitzroy some graziers have told me there is no difference between reseeded and unseeded areas within a couple of years. Even sparse pastures produce far more seed than what is flown on. A recently flooded area is probably not the best seed bed the surface tends to crust, old tussocks and debris stop soil seed contact which means you need ideal follow up rain to get establishment with no more floods. If re-seeding then it should really be asked whether Buffel is the right species to re-seed with. If flooding killed buffel this time it is likely to happen again sometime in the future. Bambatsi Panic and Floren bluegrass offer better flood tolerance for those areas that are more frequently or deeply flooded (they can cope with 3 weeks + inundation) or natives if the seed is available.
- Pastures that are grazed short are more susceptible to flood damage as taller pastures are more likely to have some leaves above the water.
- Expect weeds and annual plants in the early phases of pasture recovery. For short lived broad leafed plants they
  will die out over time as the pastures recover and become more competitive while providing some ground cover,
  to control them with herbicides you may end up chasing your tail but it can be warranted in some situations. For
  perennial weeds (especially declared weeds) early control is a good idea where possible.

Jonesy - with your monitoring sites looking at the flood recovery was there any that could compare reseeded to non-reseeded pastures? If we do set up monitoring sites I think imposing a reseeded and non-seeded treatment would be a good comparison.

Lastly I thought a little quote about Buffel from the Tropical Forages web site may interest you: "Does not survive prolonged water logging, particularly in cold season, but can stand up to 5 days of flooding with negligible adverse effect. Losses of 15-70% occur after 20 days of flooding. Tolerance of flooding varies with ecotype, the taller varieties appearing to be more flood-tolerant".

I would have thought 20 days would be a bit long for Buffel. However I have visited graziers who were after advice on flooded buffel as they were sure it was dead and what to replant with, looking across the paddock it looked dead, but close inspection showed some tussocks putting out new tillers. It may be a little tougher to flooding than I have given it credit for.

The sown pastures team is keen to contribute to fact sheets or other materials that may be created on this topic.

I think Jonesy has got more useful info from the Belyando flooding event which will be more relevant to your Central Qld flooding

Our Northern Gulf floods in 08-09 was for quite a long time with up to 10 weeks inundation of pastures in the worst

All the Gulf pastures were native species and most died under the water

As you would expect our monitoring sites showed the areas destocked after the flooding responded with a lot of annual species in the following 09-10 wet and paddocks where cattle were allowed back stayed in poor condition The light soils seemed to bounce back the best even if it was only annual species

The heavy more fertile soils did not respond as well in the following 09-10 wet but we suspect these areas were in fairly poor condition when the flood happened

The Gulf flood severely affected aprox 35 properties most with large numbers of cattle but only 5 properties drastically reduced cattle numbers in Autumn 2009 because of a lack of grass

The other 30 properties done nothing even though cattle prices were reasonable and plenty of agistment was available further south on the Downs. They run out of grass and later in 2009 thousands of head of cattle died

There was large scale mortality of buffel, however the native 3Ps stayed alive. 3 days of inundation seemed to be the level where mortalities would occur, and this was worsened if a layer of silt was deposited on the plant. My gut feeling was the better the land condition the less the mortality of buffel. The guys on the Belyando were out reseeding buffel within days as they had seen it before and knew the seedbank was needed.

A full soil profile on deep clay soils in summer with no competition from the buffel means a critical risk of weed invasion - particularly parthenium and parkinsonia. But the risk is there for all and sundry to establish. The belyando did get a lot of parthenium and it was 12 months before the buffel was well established again. Nogoa got a lot of parkinsonia.

For buffel mortality best management has to be reseed and spell until the buffel is up and competitive.

The other line of thinking is that if we keep getting these floods the native 3Ps may end up dominant and be the most sustainable pasture.



Update on this one.

Have finally been able to talk to someone (Hayley) at the property owned by Paul Thomas at Waverley Rd, Lake Manchester (near Kholo/lpswich). They have 35 horses (mostly Thoroughbreds, 2 Welshies) - 3 foals (approx 2-3 mths), 7 yearlings. Have been cut off by flood waters since 19/12/2010.

Below is what was passed on to me by Hayley:

"Have been able to get to get car across flooded cause way twice since 19/12/2010 when water dropped to approx 0.8m (water was up to bonnet). Paul picked up some human and horse supplies in those 2 occasions.

Have had no power until last few days. Have patchy mobile reception at best of times. Were unable to charge phones as no power. Did get one day when had mobile reception and sent text to Paul's mother to say desperately needed feed and vet Tx for horses.

The house has not been flood affected but 2 bridges and some fences on the pty were taken down.

Paul swam across the flooded road approx 5 times to get human food from Mt Crosby evac centre but obviously can't swim back with horse food."

Horse industry organised equine therapist and 30 bales hay and some vet supplies to be helicopter dropped to property today.

The equine therapist has assessed most horses as being condition score 2 with several horses having cuts and abrasions. A mare and foal are cut off from the mob and isolated across a river/creek. Paul has been swimming/canoeing across to feed them. One horse has died not sure if drowned or broken neck from tree falling on it.

Ken Murphy (DEEDI Agri-Science) has talked to Paul's mother (Mrs. Thomas) and he talked through multiple options available to them, none of which Mrs. Thomas wanted to take up. Apparently Mrs. Thomas became irate when talking to Ken. Both Ken and myself are a little dubious as to whether this is a legitimate request. Sorry if I have misrepresented you here Ken - please feel free to correct me. Ken elevated this situation to Rob Setter after his dealings with Mrs. Thomas as he was concerned.

Paul and Hayley are claiming they have made requests to SES, RSPCA and DEEDI and no one has responded. To make things worse Hayley's husband committed suicide before Christmas and she was unable to attend the funeral on the 21/12/2010 as she was flooded in at Lake Manchester.

I feel the horse industry will be able to handle this potential horse welfare situation with some facilitation from me. The exact details are still sketchy and I will talk to an equine vet tomorrow that I know who is in that general area and apparently has a better take on the situation. Will keep you updated as I learn more.

Quick summary of Eric Andersons work with buffel grass flooding: Survival of existing plants

- Gayndah 100% survival after 10 days and 8% survival after 15 days (96% submerged)
- American 41% survival after 10 days and 5% after 15 days (98% submerged)
- American 44% survival after 6 days and 5% survival after 12 days (50% submerged)

#### Seedbank:

Compared to controls (not flooded)

- American 35% after 10 days and 40% after 20 days
- Gayndah 15% after 10 days and 0 % after 20 days

So Erics work with existing plants never had 100% submergence. So I think we need to be clear as to whether we are talking about inundation or flooding, land or plants. A small amount of the plant not submerged can make a big difference to survival.

#### Morning all

I thought I would add a summary of comments/advice that hopefully adds to the discussion and summary that Mick sent last week. Many of the comments and advice described management options for different scenarios depending on degree of property flood effected and degree of impact on pasture condition. I have attempted to summarise the management options in a table:

Flooding period that is likely to cause pasture deaths is a little problematic as it depends on depth, time, turbidity and perhaps temperature and whether it is flowing or not - that said I thought it would be useful to put a bit of a estimate in the table for discussion.

Other points that are worth mentioning that haven't been in the discussion:

- If using silk sorghum or forage sorghum in areas that are either reseeded with permanent pasture or are
  recovering to pasture need to use very low seeding rates or the sorghum will outcompete the pasture and delay
  recovery.
- Graziers need to have a good look at their pasture over the coming weeks to observe whether the pasture is
  recovering adequately or whether they need to intervene.
- If reseeding need to consider planting legumes. The majority of buffel pastures would benefit from legume augmentation.

I hope this adds to the discussion.

#### HI all

Reseeding vs spelling and the costs and benefits of both approaches seems to be a common theme being asked. Something to think about is the proportion of the property which has been underwater for more than a few days. I have heard reports from the Dawson and Mackenzie floodplains of properties with 30 to >85% inundated. This has the biggest impact where they don't have much/any high country to shift cattle to so that flooded country can recover. Heard of one place with 2500 head being shifted on a 5 day rotation to try and keep them going until flooded country dries out. Another place with 15000 ac has had 13000 ac under water. At the other end of the scale some places have only had a small proportion under water so impacts would be smaller by comparison. So although spelling is an obvious solution, suggesting it to those properties that have been hardest hit would strike a raw nerve for those people at the moment. I guess what I'm saying is the best approach for each place could vary a lot and that should be considered when we think of how this information should be delivered to industry.

Another thing – as Gavin says is the grass really dead? How much will reshoot? I think for many places its still too early to tell – need to make sure that producers aren't jumping the gun in flying seed on straight away. There's still a good chance that this isn't the last flood for 2011 so it would be shame to put grass seed out and then having it washed away in the next few months. If forage/ silk sorghum a better option to provide short term feed before weed competition becomes an issue, or where a large proportion of the property has been affected?

I did an aerial assessment of the Dawson valley last Friday so have plenty of photos that may be informative/ useful somewhere.

Morning Everyone

We had spoken about this in the Toowoomba office as well and intend to put together a media release or something similar. We thought a few points to make were:

- Don't panic pastures are generally fairly resilient and will recover.
- Burning probably not a good idea, the plant doesn't need another stress on top of recovering from flooding.
- Spelling to allow the plants to recover and grow new leaves; and allow seedlings to come through. This is probably the most critical component of pasture recovery from flooding.
- Length of time under the flood short inundations there will be some tussocks and seed bank survive which will
  allow the pasture to recover over time. Long periods of inundation (maybe >week if deep and silt, definitely >2
  weeks for buffel) will have significant deaths and there maybe reason to reseed especially if wanting to establish a
  more flood tolerant pasture.
- Reseeding Need to consider whether the cost is warranted (depending on situation). On the lower Fitzroy some graziers have told me there is no difference between reseeded and unseeded areas within a couple of years. Even sparse pastures produce far more seed than what is flown on. A recently flooded area is probably not the best seed bed the surface tends to crust, old tussocks and debris stop soil seed contact which means you need ideal follow up rain to get establishment with no more floods. If re-seeding then it should really be asked whether Buffel is the right species to re-seed with. If flooding killed buffel this time it is likely to happen again sometime in the future. Bambatsi Panic and Floren bluegrass offer better flood tolerance for those areas that are more frequently or deeply flooded (they can cope with 3 weeks + inundation) or natives if the seed is available.
- Pastures that are grazed short are more susceptible to flood damage as taller pastures are more likely to have some leaves above the water.
- Expect weeds and annual plants in the early phases of pasture recovery. For short lived broad leafed plants they
  will die out over time as the pastures recover and become more competitive while providing some ground cover,
  to control them with herbicides you may end up chasing your tail but it can be warranted in some situations. For
  perennial weeds (especially declared weeds) early control is a good idea where possible.

Jonesy - with your monitoring sites looking at the flood recovery was there any that could compare reseeded to non-reseeded pastures? If we do set up monitoring sites I think imposing a reseeded and non-seeded treatment would be a good comparison.

Lastly I thought a little quote about Buffel from the Tropical Forages web site may interest you: "Does not survive prolonged water logging, particularly in cold season, but can stand up to 5 days of flooding with negligible adverse effect. Losses of 15-70% occur after 20 days of flooding. Tolerance of flooding varies with ecotype, the taller varieties appearing to be more flood-tolerant".

I would have thought 20 days would be a bit long for Buffel. However I have visited graziers who were after advice on flooded buffel as they were sure it was dead and what to replant with, looking across the paddock it looked dead, but close inspection showed some tussocks putting out new tillers. It may be a little tougher to flooding than I have given it credit for.

The sown pastures team is keen to contribute to fact sheets or other materials that may be created on this topic.

I think Jonesy has got more useful info from the Belyando flooding event which will be more relevant to your Central Qld flooding

Our Northern Gulf floods in 08-09 was for quite a long time with up to 10 weeks inundation of pastures in the worst affected areas

All the Gulf pastures were native species and most died under the water

As you would expect our monitoring sites showed the areas destocked after the flooding responded with a lot of annual species in the following 09-10 wet and paddocks where cattle were allowed back stayed in poor condition The light soils seemed to bounce back the best even if it was only annual species

The heavy more fertile soils did not respond as well in the following 09-10 wet but we suspect these areas were in fairly poor condition when the flood happened

The Gulf flood severely affected aprox 35 properties most with large numbers of cattle but only 5 properties drastically reduced cattle numbers in Autumn 2009 because of a lack of grass

The other 30 properties done nothing even though cattle prices were reasonable and plenty of agistment was available further south on the Downs. They run out of grass and later in 2009 thousands of head of cattle died

There was large scale mortality of buffel, however the native 3Ps stayed alive. 3 days of inundation seemed to be the level where mortalities would occur, and this was worsened if a layer of silt was deposited on the plant. My gut feeling was the better the land condition the less the mortality of buffel. The guys on the Belyando were out reseeding buffel within days as they had seen it before and knew the seedbank was needed.

A full soil profile on deep clay soils in summer with no competition from the buffel means a critical risk of weed invasion - particularly parthenium and parkinsonia. But the risk is there for all and sundry to establish. The belyando did get a lot of parthenium and it was 12 months before the buffel was well established again. Nogoa got a lot of parkinsonia.

For buffel mortality best management has to be reseed and spell until the buffel is up and competitive.

The other line of thinking is that if we keep getting these floods the native 3Ps may end up dominant and be the most sustainable pasture.

Calvin Muller, a Warracknabeal farmer and fellow committee member, has suggested we look at coordinating the donation of hay to affected farmers in Queensland. We have discussed a few ideas and believe it is feasible to institute a program over the next couple of weeks that would manage donations, transport and funding.

#### Very briefly:

- there is significant hay available around the place,
- transport capacity will become available as the Victorian harvest concludes over the next few weeks,
- a website could easily be quickly developed to assist coordination of donations, transport, funds for fuel, accommodation for drivers, recipient requirements,
- Rotarian farmers with harvest completed would likely be able to assist with transport, administration and coordination,
- Rotary clubs between here and Queensland could be mobilised to donate fuel, meals and billets,
- With trucks on the road there may be opportunities to assist with other logistical needs,
- Hay is not likely to be needed for some days or even weeks (too wet to get in) so we have an opportunity to make sound preparations.

I was hoping to have a quick chat to you today but given how busy we are down here I can only imagine what it is like up there and so will resort to email and hopefully catch up early next week.

#### Fodder donations

As mentioned on the teleconference we recognise that there is a QDPI and Agforce contact but I would expect their phones to possibly have melted by now. Any calls we are getting for fodder (and that includes those that our DPI is referring through to us) we are just keeping a register of and letting them know that at this stage we are waiting to see how best to use any donations. Once you have an arrangement with QDPI or whoever please let me know. One consideration is that as we cover a range of industries I am fielding calls from more than just dairy farmers.

#### Information

On the recovery front we are probably about 1 week ahead of you given north NSW flooded over a week ago so people are well into mop up. As such we are working with NSWDPI and DA on herd health information and any support on farm. We will continue to liaise with Neal Price and DA to ensure no resources are duplicated unnecessarily. At this stage we are getting feedback to be cautious about overload and that

farmers probably cannot handle info sessions at this stage so it will be a challenge to balance this with getting info out.

#### **Prices**

Adrian D is keen to look at alternatives to government assistance to get a better financial return to farmers. As such we are looking at possibilities that might give a short term injection to milk cheques. One is along the lines of AECL (eggs) that a couple of years ago where they got an increase in their levy (probably not preferable) or another is the flexibility in the supermarket contracts to have a step up (presuming cooperation from processors to pass this back through). Adrian D was going to speak with Peter Stalle to see what reaction he had to this. I would be interested in your thoughts but we would be happy to pursue this with ADF given your focus on farm.

The Queensland plant Biosecurity issues on account of branched broomrape follow (ie from within 50 Km of Murray Bridge in SA):

The relevant extract of our Plant Protection Regulation 2002 (ie for branched broomrape) is attached for your reference.

FYI, the (Old) Plant Protection Regulation 2002 refers to branched broomrape in section 135, as follows:

135B Restriction on moving high risk items (1) A person must not, without an inspector's approval, move a high risk item that the person knows, or ought reasonably to know, has been in a branched broomrape pest area— (a) into the pest quarantine area; or (b) from a parcel of land in the pest quarantine area to another parcel of land in the area. (2) An inspector may give an approval, with or without conditions, only if the inspector is satisfied the movement of

the high risk item will not pose a significant risk of— (a) introducing branched broomrape into the pest quarantine area; or (b) spreading branched broomrape in the pest quarantine area. (3) In this section— branched broomrape pest area means an area in a State, other than an area in Queensland, within 50km of an infestation of branched broomrape. high risk item means any of the following— (a) soil; (b) an appliance; (c) an animal kept, or usually kept, for a domestic purpose or in a captive state; (d) a plant. plant includes— (a) grain, legumes and oilseed; and (b) fodder made from a crop plant; and (c) fruit and vegetables; and (d) the part of a crop plant remaining after its seed is harvested.

With respect to weed seeds, Cameron has always told me that IP&A (Jef Cummings or Steve Csurhes) will need to advise, as it is not our area. Jef & Steve, I have just been advised you are working from PIB. Please advise where exactly, so I can come and discuss with you.

Please advise how this pans out, as I would like to know for my future reference.

Some growers have had inundation over 50 - 70% or more of their properties, and will have to replace considerable area's of fencing. Given they have to replace this fencing some were asking about who to talk to in terms of improving the property layout?

I have referred this to local FBA officers here at Biloela and to the DCCA co-ordinator at Theodore, but am struggling for who you would go to for expertise on practical layout design tips. They (the growers) were not looking for mapping or mapping software, rather they were looking for design guides and tips for improved stock handling & movement on their farms through better laid out fencing.

My approach would be to look at;

- What were the problems for farming and stock with the previous layout i.e. how landtypes are fenced, paddock shapes, stock movement
- What infrastructure is repeatedly prone to damage i.e. how can river crossings be reduced, do sections of fence need to be moved
- What cannot be changed i.e. houses, good yards, a lot of watering points.

If a property does not have a good landtype map it could be useful to get one.

Getting mapping from this flood might be useful.

Do we need to get people together to identify exactly what they want?

This might help us identify common needs i.e. landtype or flood mapping and document particular property needs we can follow up on?

All centrally funded programs aimed at business and industry growth are I believe being (or can be) fine-tuned for better applicability in the post-flood environment, eg QMI programs, small business workshops, mentoring, etc. We are already considering this for FCW, eg substituting business resilience workshops for more general ones such as customer service, etc. Note, with small businesses (especially in rural areas) very hard hit on already thin profit margins, we should also seriously consider subsidising workshops 100% rather than charging standard fees (\$44).

Some small carryover special funds held locally for regional industry development and are also being used for this purpose.

No major high level business and industry program suggests itself.

Building Rural Communities fund usually provides some part time employment or work for contractors in smaller communities.

Material has been circulated on indemnity for individual public servants, although this is unlikely to be needed in almost every case. Some discussion about the need to ensure we have our records available (Trevor), and about the need to coordinate the presentation of a single Queensland government 'case' to the Commission. DPC will take this forward, together with Crown Law;
- (c) The Recovery Authority, as announced this morning by the Premier. The Authority will be a statutory one, with Graham Newton as CEO, reporting to a Board, chaired by General Slater, and through the board to a Minister (yet to be identified). The existing work we are doing on economic recovery is to continue, and

we must be clear with our collaborators in the private sector and peak bodies that their investment in this effort is absolutely worthwhile and that the work will continue. The Recovery Authority CEO is likely to have powers equivalent to the Coordinator-General;

(d) The Under Treasurer outlined budget processes, with a belated mid year update probably in February, and a budget process currently aiming towards June. The Treasury is now looking for ideas of major programs that can be cut, with bids sought over the next week.

This will be an EMG item. Treasury will be negotiating a national partnership agreement with the Federal government for financial assistance; negotiations commencing on Friday. We will also need to contribute an assessment of damage to state assets, to ensure this is built into the calculations. I would be grateful if Susan and Trevor could take the lead on this. I would also be grateful if Susan could take the lead on putting together a proposal to the Treasury which we would need to clear with the relevant Ministers for aspects of our budget which could be substantially reduced.

We also heard presentations from the new Queensland Chief Scientist, Geoff Garrett, and from the Auditor-General, who has unaccountability not yet been able to reoccupy his building and resume work.



there are three Biosecurity requirements for hay entering Queensland.

- 1/ Each source property that donates hay will need to fill out a IPA Weed Hygiene-Declaration (attached). The declaration forms will need to travel with the consignment and be handed to the receivers of the hay in Qld.
- 2/ The transporter will also need to complete part 2 of one of the declaration forms that applies to each truck load of hay.
- 3/ You will need to contact the NSW Dept Agriculture directly and obtain an Inspectors Approval for each consignment of hay. The Inspectors Approval will describe how the consignment meets Qld Plant Entry Condition 10 (copy attached)

Hi there. This is Rev Peter Taubner, currently the Uniting Church Minister in the Isis Parish, serving the communities and congregations of Childers, Biggenden and Woodgate. During the recent flood crisis which affected much of Queensland, our local area was not inconvenienced too much. We were travel restricted due to road closures at Gympie, Maryborough and Bundaberg, and there were some issues with access to some farms and properties but certainly not as many problems to overcome as elsewhere.

Some folk receiving this email will also know that I was previously linked to the Dawson and Callide Valleys, which included the areas of Theodore, Baralaba, Wowan and Thangool. My time spent in the Central Queensland Presbytery area, also means that I have limited knowledge of other rural places such as Emerald, Alpha and Jericho. All of the places listed, and elsewhere, have had significant inundation and are undergoing flood recovery. During conversation and discussion locally, I had one particularly concerned farming family, from the Biggenden congregation, make a generous offer of approx 700 bales of hay, to perhaps help out with stock feed for some affected farmers in the areas above, or elsewhere.

This started us all thinking a little wider and we have now come up with the idea of working on this project that we are calling, as a sort of 'catch cry' - "BALE OUT YOUR MATES".

This email is being sent out to first inform you, and then to further test the idea. We have this initial hay crop ready to be harvested and around 700 hay bales will result. Preparing this crop will be done later this week and the bales will be ready for transport and delivery perhaps on the weekend (Jan 22-23) or soon after. These first bales are being offered at no cost to those who may need some stock feed in the near future but we will need help with delivery and distribution.

I will be sending this note to many people in my email Contacts List but this does not mean it will reach all those who may be interested because their internet may still be down or other tasks are taking up their time.

I am asking, on behalf of the folk of the Isis Parish, that you might help out in any, or all, of three ways -

- 1 Let people know that this offer is available and building momentum. Forward this email to others or contact those who might benefit or help out, by using other local means (landline, mobile, word of mouth).
- 2 Perhaps other farmers/businesses have excess or soon-to-be ready crops that could be added to our supply. These additions to the supply need to either be at no cost or at a significantly reduced cost. Let them know my contact details and let me know theirs, if you can.
- 3 Trucks or vehicles with trailers that can help to transport and distribute are also needed. Perhaps a discount or help with fuel costs can be worked out. As delivery dates draw near, precise location details will need to be supplied.

Thanks for your help with getting this idea out there.

Duncan Weir (Crop Science) has also been running a number of 'Flood Assistance Seminars' with BIS in South Region; Central has been doing similar – this info should be posted on the DEEDI intranet soon. I'd recommend that beef staff in flood-affected locations attend these with the view of running similar where demand is likely – key contact officers will need to liaise with Duncan Weir on this.

This is Rev Peter Taubner, currently the Uniting Church Minister in the Isis Parish,

serving the communities and congregations of Childers, Biggenden and Woodgate.

During the recent flood crisis which affected much of Queensland, our local area

was not inconvenienced too much. We were travel restricted due to road closures at

Gympie, Maryborough and Bundaberg, and there were some issues with access to some farms and properties but certainly not as many problems to overcome as elsewhere.

Some folk receiving this email will also know that I was previously linked to the

Dawson and Callide Valleys, which included the areas of Theodore, Baralaba, Wowan and Thangool.

My time spent in the Central Queensland Presbytery area, also means that I have limited

knowledge of other rural places such as Emerald, Alpha and Jericho.

All of the places listed, and elsewhere, have had significant inundation and are undergoing flood recovery.

During conversation and discussion locally, I had one particularly concerned farming family,

from the Biggenden congregation, make a generous offer of approx 700 bales of hay,

to perhaps help out with stock feed for some affected farmers in the areas above, or elsewhere.

This started us all thinking a little wider and we have now come up with the idea of working

on this project that we are calling, as a sort of 'catch cry' - \*"BALE OUT YOUR MATES".

This email is being sent out to first inform you, and then to further test the idea.

We have this initial hay crop ready to be harvested and around 700 hay bales will result.

Preparing this crop will be done later this week and the bales will be ready for

transport and delivery perhaps on the weekend (Jan 22-23) or soon after. These first bales are being offered at no cost to those who may need some stock feed

in the near future but we will need help with delivery and distribution.

I will be sending this note to many people in my email Contacts List but this does

not mean it will reach all those who may be interested because their internet

may still be down or other tasks are taking up their time.

I am asking, on behalf of the folk of the Isis Parish, that you might help out in any, or all, of three ways -

\*1 \*\*Let people know that this offer is available and building momentum.

Forward this email to others or contact those who might benefit or help out, by using other local means (landline, mobile, word of mouth).\*

- \*2 \*\*Perhaps other farmers/businesses have excess or soon-to-be ready crops that could be added to our supply. These additions to the supply need to either be at no cost or at a significantly reduced cost.

  Let them know my contact details and let me know theirs, if you can.\*
- \*\*Trucks or vehicles with trailers that can help to transport and distribute are also needed. Perhaps a discount or help with fuel costs can be worked out.

As delivery dates draw near, precise location details will need to be supplied.\*



There are plenty of good ideas here to kick start some info for the punters. I've volunteered / been volunteered to coordinate activities so we aren't duplicating each others efforts and will put forward a plan below to get things rolling. This is by no means definitive and we will make changes as things develop but I get the feeling there is a lot of information out there in people's heads, but not too much written, so we need to make a start somewhere and see how things pan out.

There seem to be several topic areas developing around which we could write farm notes and develop press releases, and I've listed these below. With each topic I've listed people who could write the farm notes, help prepare them and perhaps act as media contact points for their regions. From what has come out so far there will be regional differences with pastures and land types so there seems a need to take a regional approach. I've highlighted who I think could be a key regional contact to coordinate and write the farm notes with others to contribrute. If your name is not on the list and you have something to contribute, don't hesitate to add your piece.

The following is a potential list of farm notes with key people highlighted, others to contribute, (and anyone else who would like to contribute):

- Weeds post flooding events where perennial grasses have been killed Jenny Milson, Dave Phelps, Bernie
- Weeds, particularly woody weeds, that will emerge given the bumper season we have been experiencing, and control strategies and techniques - Jenny Milson, Trevor Hall, Col Paton, Bernie English

- The mechanics of flooding and how it kills pastures, flooding effects on soils and nutrients Lew Markey, Jenny Milson, Gavin Peck
- Regional perspectives on flooding and effects on different pastures and land types, what species are effected with
  different durations of flooding, including sown pastures, buffel and leuc, and strategies for recovery CQ -Gavin
  Peck, Paul Jones, Morrie Conway; WQ David Phelps, Jenny Milson; SQ Gavin Peck, Trevor Hall and
  Richard Silcock (MB), NQ Bernie English, Joe Roplfe; SEQ Damien O'Sullivan, Ian McConnel and Russ T,
  Mackay Whitsundays Ross Dodt, Jim Fletcher

A suggested structure for the last farm note topic, pasture recovery after flooding from a regional perspective:

- An overview of the effects of flooding on different pasture species, how long different species will survive inundation
- As Gavin says below, Don't panic: wait and see how they recover. A few plants will set more seed than you can sow
- Strategies for recovery including spelling, strategic grazing where appropriate, resowing if needed, appropritae species for resowing that might better withstand inundation
- Strategies for managing stock, as per Rod's suggestions below
- Encourage people to monitor the results with at least some photos from the same points

From drafts of these, develop press releases and radio talks for regional ABC (Rural Reports and Country Hour) and commercial stations. The following people to cover/give the talks:

- Weeds post flooding and with good seasonal rainfall Jenny Milson WQ, Trevor Hall, Gavin Peck SQ, Damien O'Sullivan, Ian McConnel and Russ T SEQ, Bernie E NQ, Jonesy CQ;
- Flooding effects on pastures Jonesy CQ, Trevor Hall and or Gavin Peck SQ, Jenny M WQ, Damien O, Ian McConnel and Russ T SEQ, Bernie E NQ, Ross Dodt and Jim Fletcher Mackay Whitsundays

I suggest we could start developing the farm notes next week with the aim of some press releases in the following week. Air and newspaper space might be available by then as things begin to calm down.

I welcome any feedback. This is not meant to be prescriptive but to help make it look like we are all "singing from the same hymn sheet".

### HI all

Reseeding vs spelling and the costs and benefits of both approaches seems to be a common theme being asked. Something to think about is the proportion of the property which has been underwater for more than a few days. I have heard reports from the Dawson and Mackenzie floodplains of properties with 30 to >85% inundated. This has the biggest impact where they don't have much/any high country to shift cattle to so that flooded country can recover. Heard of one place with 2500 head being shifted on a 5 day rotation to try and keep them going until flooded country dries out. Another place with 15000 ac has had 13000 ac under water. At the other end of the scale some places have only had a small proportion under water so impacts would be smaller by comparison. So although spelling is an obvious solution, suggesting it to those properties that have been hardest hit would strike a raw nerve for those people at the moment. I guess what I'm saying is the best approach for each place could vary a lot and that should be considered when we think of how this information should be delivered to industry.

Another thing – as Gavin says is the grass really dead? How much will reshoot? I think for many places its still too early to tell – need to make sure that producers aren't jumping the gun in flying seed on straight away. There's still a good chance that this isn't the last flood for 2011 so it would be shame to put grass seed out and then having it washed away in the next few months. If forage/ silk sorghum a better option to provide short term feed before weed competition becomes an issue, or where a large proportion of the property has been affected?

I did an aerial assessment of the Dawson valley last Friday so have plenty of photos that may be informative/ useful somewhere.

### Morning Everyone

We had spoken about this in the Toowoomba office as well and intend to put together a media release or something similar. We thought a few points to make were:

- Don't panic pastures are generally fairly resilient and will recover.
- · Burning probably not a good idea, the plant doesn't need another stress on top of recovering from flooding.
- Spelling to allow the plants to recover and grow new leaves; and allow seedlings to come through. This is
  probably the most critical component of pasture recovery from flooding.
- Length of time under the flood short inundations there will be some tussocks and seed bank survive which will allow the pasture to recover over time. Long periods of inundation (maybe >week if deep and silt, definitely >2 weeks for buffel) will have significant deaths and there maybe reason to reseed especially if wanting to establish a more flood tolerant pasture.
- Reseeding Need to consider whether the cost is warranted (depending on situation). On the lower Fitzroy some graziers have told me there is no difference between reseeded and unseeded areas within a couple of years. Even sparse pastures produce far more seed than what is flown on. A recently flooded area is probably not the best seed bed the surface tends to crust, old tussocks and debris stop soil seed contact which means you need ideal follow up rain to get establishment with no more floods. If re-seeding then it should really be asked whether Buffel is the right species to re-seed with. If flooding killed buffel this time it is likely to happen again sometime in the future. Bambatsi Panic and Floren bluegrass offer better flood tolerance for those areas that are more frequently or deeply flooded (they can cope with 3 weeks + inundation) or natives if the seed is available.
- Pastures that are grazed short are more susceptible to flood damage as taller pastures are more likely to have some leaves above the water.
- Expect weeds and annual plants in the early phases of pasture recovery. For short lived broad leafed plants they
  will die out over time as the pastures recover and become more competitive while providing some ground cover,
  to control them with herbicides you may end up chasing your tail but it can be warranted in some situations. For
  perennial weeds (especially declared weeds) early control is a good idea where possible.

Jonesy - with your monitoring sites looking at the flood recovery was there any that could compare reseeded to non-reseeded pastures? If we do set up monitoring sites I think imposing a reseeded and non-seeded treatment would be a good comparison.

Lastly I thought a little quote about Buffel from the Tropical Forages web site may interest you: "Does not survive prolonged water logging, particularly in cold season, but can stand up to 5 days of flooding with negligible adverse effect. Losses of 15-70% occur after 20 days of flooding. Tolerance of flooding varies with ecotype, the taller varieties appearing to be more flood-tolerant".

I would have thought 20 days would be a bit long for Buffel. However I have visited graziers who were after advice on flooded buffel as they were sure it was dead and what to replant with, looking across the paddock it looked dead, but close inspection showed some tussocks putting out new tillers. It may be a little tougher to flooding than I have given it credit for.

The sown pastures team is keen to contribute to fact sheets or other materials that may be created on this topic.

I think Jonesy has got more useful info from the Belyando flooding event which will be more relevant to your Central Qld flooding

Our Northern Gulf floods in 08-09 was for quite a long time with up to 10 weeks inundation of pastures in the worst affected areas

All the Gulf pastures were native species and most died under the water

As you would expect our monitoring sites showed the areas destocked after the flooding responded with a lot of annual species in the following 09-10 wet and paddocks where cattle were allowed back stayed in poor condition The light soils seemed to bounce back the best even if it was only annual species

The heavy more fertile soils did not respond as well in the following 09-10 wet but we suspect these areas were in fairly poor condition when the flood happened

The Gulf flood severely affected aprox 35 properties most with large numbers of cattle but only 5 properties drastically reduced cattle numbers in Autumn 2009 because of a lack of grass

The other 30 properties done nothing even though cattle prices were reasonable and plenty of agistment was available further south on the Downs. They run out of grass and later in 2009 thousands of head of cattle died

There was large scale mortality of buffel, however the native 3Ps stayed alive. 3 days of inundation seemed to be the level where mortalities would occur, and this was worsened if a layer of silt was deposited on the plant. My gut feeling was the better the land condition the less the mortality of buffel. The guys on the Belyando were out reseeding buffel within days as they had seen it before and knew the seedbank was needed.

A full soil profile on deep clay soils in summer with no competition from the buffel means a critical risk of weed invasion - particularly parthenium and parkinsonia. But the risk is there for all and sundry to establish. The belyando did get a lot of parthenium and it was 12 months before the buffel was well established again. Nogoa got a lot of parkinsonia.

For buffel mortality best management has to be reseed and spell until the buffel is up and competitive.

The other line of thinking is that if we keep getting these floods the native 3Ps may end up dominant and be the most sustainable pasture.



From 1st January I had close liasion with producers along the Dawson River from Theodore to Duaringa. I asked Brett Coombe if he would travel with the helicopter to provide local experience and direction for fodder drops. This saved considerable time and allowed smooth and efficient operation to all affected properties that sought help in the worst affected areas from Moura to Baralaba. The helicopter operated by David Fox remained in this district and did a great job continuing to do fodder drops for almost a fortnight. The inquiry from the Theodore district was provided with cntacts for fodder and said they had a family member with a helicopter that could assist with the fodder drops for them.

Numerous offers of fodder came from hay producers throughout the Banana Shire and further afield into NSW, Victoria and SA as well as most other districts of Queensland after I did several interviews with ABC radio that went nationwide through the Country Hour. Many regional papers also picked up the requests for fodder especially throughout NSW and Vic.

Fodder drop activity also took place in the Central Highland Regional Council area along the Dawson River near Duaringa, north of Dingo on the Mackenzie River and on Nagoa Floodplain near Emerald. Regards.....Ken

NATIONAL BACKGROUND COMMENTS: Week ending 27<sup>th</sup> January 2011. Please note that direct links to reports on each dairy region immediately follow this national summary for grain and hay. National Summary - Grain:

- Harvest is still continuing in southern parts of the country with mainly feed grades coming off. The majority of the wheat will have sprouted and the barely cleaved with the excessive moisture that has fallen in December and November. It is anticipated that the state's winter crop harvest will now not be completed until the middle of February, as rain during late December and early January caused more delays with access to already wet and inaccessible paddocks.
- The Bureau of Meteorology has released rainfall data with QLD recording its wettest year on record. NSW and SA third wettest year on record, VIC fifth wettest year on record. While in WA has had its direst year on record.
- The summer sorghum harvest has kicked off in the Moree district with quality reports are good and yield indications look very good and are likely to be above previous years for the regions. Due to the favourable growing season. The usual higher yielding eastern area, where flooding will reduce area and yield potential will still produce good levels to restock empty sorghum bids.

- Grain yields of most crops across the east coast have been above long term average yields, with some growers recording the highest yields ever. Grain quality has been the biggest issue across all crops, with significant downgrading occurring as the harvest draws to a close.
- The final extent of the downgrading of quality of this year's winter crop will not be known for several months as growers now begin to deliver grain stored on farm into the bulk handling system or directly to end users. A significant amount of grain has been stored on farm as farm access by trucks was hampered by the wet conditions, a shortage of road transport and the availability of grain silo bagging systems on farms.
- US wheat futures continue to advance on increased demand from Middle East and North African nations, against historical high US stocks. Global stocks are tighter and availability of quality milling grades is also limiting, providing price support. Tight global feed grain stocks are providing price support to feed grade wheat which currently would make up a greater than normal proportion of global stocks. If demand were to ease price corrections lower for current year contracts are likely. Buyers are nervous about the potential for poor weather to hurt coming winter wheat harvests, as well. Key growing areas in China and the western US Plains are struggling without rain.
- Most grades across Qld and NSW are up down \$5 \$12/mt reflecting the increasing glut of feed wheat along the east coast. In Victoria wheat is steady whilst feed barley is up \$10/mt. The increased international demand for grain in SA has pushed prices higher by \$15 \$20/mt. WA prices are up \$10/mt better reflecting their true value, while in Northern Tasmania wheat prices are down \$30 while other grades are steady.
- Dairy Australia has produced a Fact Sheet on the feeding of weather-damaged grain. Check this
  out on the Dairy Australia website at <a href="https://www.dairyaustralia.com.au">www.dairyaustralia.com.au</a>. Although not suitable for the
  milling/malting trade, weather damaged grains offer an excellent feed source for the dairy trade.

#### National Summary - Hay:

- Due to its long growing season Lucerne is becoming a shining light in the hay and dairy industry. While first cuts around the country were generally weather damaged subsequent second and third cuts are being produced without damage and good yields.
- However with recent flooding many lucerne stands close to northern Victorian river systems will have their production drastically reduced.
- It is becoming widely acknowledged that there simply is not a large volume of hay around. Two main factors have inhibited production. Firstly the large percentages of paddocks that were cut for hay and then because of persistent wet weather windrows were abandoned and livestock turned onto the paddocks. Secondly the hay that was baled, albeit rain damaged, has now been damaged by excessive rain and floodwaters. The pressure to supply hay of any quality will be challenging in the coming autumn and winter months.
- Victorian hay stocks are being affected by floods. It is conservative to say that for square bales stored outside that are typically stacked six high, that one third of stocks will not be used for livestock consumption. There are many cases of whole stacks falling over due to the sagging of bottom bales, causing the whole stack to be lying in water for many days. This put further pressure on hay supplies for the coming autumn and winter.
- It is still too early to determine what demand will be emanate from Queensland and northern

NSW feedlots. Pasture growth after the floods have receded will play a crucial role to the amount of cattle on feed over the coming months.

- With disappointment many dairy farmers are opening up their silage pits and bales to find that the quality is not as expected and protein levels are historically lower. This has encouraged odd sales of lucerne hay to be mixed with on farm silage.
- With this in mind it may be worthwhile feed testing pit and baled silage to avoid any unnecessary surprises. Planning and, if need be, buying now may well pay dividends compared to being exposed to higher prices for high protein hay later on in the autumn when the scramble is on.
- The Queensland floods and their affect on the hay market is still yet to play out. What we do know, is that much of the south east summer forage crop production will be depleted, eg lucerne, millet, sorghum, maize.
- This can be offset by importing Lucerne from South Australia, which has been happening for some months now, and should set to continue with substantial yields from southern lucerne crops.
- Hay production from winter crops and pastures across the majority of the country are in the bale albeit with extreme variance in quality and nutritional value.
- With high yielding crops along the eastern state there may be a false perception that there is plenty of hay around. This is not actually the case. Hay of reasonable nutritional value without weather damage is in limited supply and producers are happy to store hay in shed and see how the autumn and winter hay markets pan out.
- There is a second chance for those with lucerne paddocks to make hay without weather damage from second and third cuts. Given the decrease in water prices and increase in production from dryland stands lucerne could will play a pivotal role in supplying high protein fodder to the dairy market this year. However if quality is good enough the chaff market will be a fierce competitor.
- There is strong demand for lucerne form the horse industry as Northern NSW and South East Oueensland have also not been able to produce lucerne without weather damage.
- Partly due to weather damage but also the high yielding crops are producing hay of lower nutritional value. The message here is, buy with a feedtest, so there will be no surprises when milk is in the vat.
- It is important to consider that while it seems there is an abundance of paddock feed and conserved fodder around, the reality is that the majority of hay is weather damaged and will only be suitable for fibre in the winter time.
- At least 50% of the Victorian vetch crop has weather damage along with 1<sup>st</sup> cut lucerne.
- Extensive rain damage to hay crops is common throughout all Eastern Australian States. To the point where windrows are being abandoned and stock turned on to these paddocks.
- Whatever way you look at it high quality hay is in short supply. Typically there is always a need for hay in late autumn early winter. There is almost certainly the chance there will be a scramble for hay without weather damage and prices will adjust accordingly. Now may be a good time to

purchase at least a portion of what is envisaged will be needed.

- Nationally the variance in quality and nutritional value of hay will be extreme. Oaten hay yields vary across the country from ½t/ha to 17 t/ha. Metabolisable Energy from these crops range from 11ME to 6ME respectively. The message here is for the Eastern State hay buyer's, don't expect this seasons hay to produce the same volume of milk as hay from previous years of drought stressed crops where sugar and energy levels were much higher. Insist on a feed analysis from your hay supplier.
- In contrast those in Western Australia may be able to feed less, given the high quality of cereal hay this year. Your nutritionist will be a valuable resource here.
- An uninspiring hay market at the moment. Producers are experiencing challenging curing conditions in eastern Australia. Rain has been consistently each weekend for the past six weeks extensively damaging hay in windrows.
- There are many crops in Northern Victoria that were cut which simply won't be baled the damage is that bad.
- If high protein hay is used in your operation and your hay supplier has new seasons of good quality it may be prudent to secure a portion now in order to reduce the risk of not being able to find any in the summer and autumn.
- Canola hay is available in Western Australia and with it some aspects need to be considered
  when feeding to cows. Nitrate/Nitrite levels in canola hay can be toxic to livestock if too high.
  Nitrate/nitrite levels can be tested from a core sample in conjunction with a regular fodder test.
- Canola hay can be valuable as part of a ration, and advice from a nutritionist experienced in feeding canola hay should be sought before making purchasing decisions.
- Potentially high levels of nitrate are summarised in the following table with two test methods.

- Rain is the prime dictator of hay quantity but this year rain or lack of it, is dramatically dictating quality. The dry season in Western Australia has led to cereal crops of exceptional quality.
- Like never before will feedtest results be so important. Given exceptional seasonal conditions in the Eastern States, cereal crop yields per hectare will be high. It is anticipated that as a result of high yielding crops, energy and protein levels will be lower than in previous years where crops have been drought stressed and sugar levels higher.



#### Hello Phil

I agree with Eslyn that face to face workshops/forums are more effective when two things are happening - the emotions are high and people have inexperience in knowing the critical success factors of the business.

The key for a disaster affected company (as with any other) is cash flow. The most common cause of business failure is lack of cash at the crucial time. Our check sheets on web say this but people do not understand what a cash flow forecast does for them. In more cases than not they do not have them (even after reading the website). Without good financial analysis of the health of the company proprietors may make inappropriate decisions including, in some cases, to resurrect their business when it isn't going to make it without radical change.

Our current website has good information on what documents a business owner should have to analyse their financial health but I'm not convinced that this provides the understanding that prompts the owner to do it.

As Eslyn has summarised, following a disaster, we have seen that a business owner's focus is on insurance, paying and keeping staff, how to restock, managing debtors and managing their emotions. Except the emotions part, handling the other points of focus would be so much easier if the business did an effective future looking financial analysis.

So how can we best help - not sure on the best answer but think it would include these elements:

- face to face workshops to get people to identify the critical success factors particular to their own business and how to fulfil these
- · Electronic information to back this up
- Links to subsidized counselling support to help on the emotional level
- Web based ability to network with other companies who are going through a hard time to share experiences and ideas
- Subsidized telephone mentoring with a professional business consultant
- A program to educate accountants on how to identify the critical success factors of a business, the
  value of future cash flow,P & L and balance sheet documents updated and analysed on a regular
  basis.

While it may well and good to have a toolkit available whether it is this one or others which are available online through <a href="https://www.business.qld.gov.au">www.business.qld.gov.au</a> I am not too sure that businesses would have the time or the mindset at the moment to spend the time going through this online material.

What I have gathered from the businesses I have dealt with since January both in Rockhampton and Emerald is that for the immediate future (over the next few months) what they really want to do is to get back into running their businesses and this is taking a lot of their strength both emotionally and physically. From worries with insurance companies (if they were lucky enough to have insurance) and the fact that a large number have been told that they will not get insurance in the future to how they are going to restock, where the stock is coming from, internal repairs to the premises, how/if some of their debtors are going to be able to pay given that a large number of these are in the same situation as they are. Quite a number of businesses in Emerald more so than Rockhampton have been hit with a double whammy because they have been inundated with water in their homes as well and the shortage of vacant houses in Emerald has compounded the issues as well.

The upshot is that whilst it might be nice to have the online material available for them to access I feel that a workshop/seminar situation may be more beneficial, where there is open discussion business wise as well as the emotional aspect of the problems they are facing and also knowing that they are not alone in this situation. Quite a number of businesses both in Rockhampton and Emerald which I have visited have just wanted to talk about their issues even if it was evident to them that we could not assist them and I must say that everyone I spoke to both face to face and on the phone were very appreciative to think that we as a Government Department have taken the time to speak to them.

Yes, it might be nice to offer the online material and depending on the material it might be worthwhile to have a session, or put the material on a CD and offer to the businesses free of charge for them to view/keep for future reference as they wish. We must also keep in mind all the other providers out there who are offering similar material and not become involved in overloading the clients.
